Eight Month Response (Resubmission) to the Citric Acid

Reregistration Eligibility Document (RED)

Dear Ms. Oxford:

This is in response to your October 24, 1994 submission for reregistration of the subject product under the Citric Acid RED. Since the product cannot be reregistered until all requirements for it are satisfied under the Mineral Acids RED, this submission is being treated as a registration amendment.

The amendment referred to above - the revised product labeling and the revised Confidential Statement of Formula dated October 20, 1994 - submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable subject to the comments listed below. stamped copy of the labeling is enclosed for your records.

- 1. Submit five copies of the finished labeling before the product is released for shipment bearing the amended labeling.
- 2. We note that the two statements under the product name read, "CIP ACID SANITIZER" and "For Dairy and Food Processing Equipment". (These statements are obscured and not reproducible on the draft copy.)

In regard to item 2 in your letter: as stated in the latest acute toxicity review (which was enclosed with our September 27, 1994 letter), particle size data have not been included in your waiver requests. An acute inhalation toxicity study is still required for the concentrate (the product as sold). In regard to

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labeling, the review indicates that precautionary labeling reflective of an acute inhalation category I rating may be submitted in lieu of an acute inhalation toxicity study. labeling may not include the word "Poison" but would include mention of a respiratory protective device.) Additional details in the review indicate that the registrant may conduct an acute inhalation study on the most concentrated use dilution in order to demonstrate that a respiratory device is not necessary for handling the diluted product. If this conclusion is borne out, applicators will be relieved of the respiratory protective device requirement; however, labeling for initial handlers or persons who dilute the product will still reflect toxicity category I for acute inhalation, and for them a respiratory protective device will be required. Note that these options are based on our general policy, and are not meant to suggest that we have concluded that the product would be placed in acute inhalation toxicity category I were an acceptable study available.

Any further reregistration-related acute toxicity reviews and comments by the Agency concerning the required acute oral and acute inhalation toxicity studies will be made in conjunction with the Mineral Acids RED. Correspondence regarding this product pursuant to the Citric Acid RED is now completed.
