Subsequent applications of 2.3 to 13.9 fluid ounces of Ampicide 9 per 1000 gallons of water should be employed every 7 to 9 days, or as required. The frequency of application depends upon the relative amount of bleedoff and the severity of the infestation. Repeat applications should be made on the same day of the week.
