Repeat spraying as often as necessary. Do not remain in treated areas. Ventilate the area after treatment is completed.

WASP NESTS: Spray directly on insects, nests and hiding places. Application should be made in late evening (if possible) when wasps return to their nests.

Mix: 42.5 ounces of National Chemsearch DOUBLE-QUICK with sufficient oil to equal one gallon of diluted spray. Apply a light mist sufficient to wet the tips of the hair on beef and dairy cattle, horses and dogs.

To protect against: STABLE FLIES HORSE FLIES
 DEER FLIES

Apply the above dilution at two ounces per individual animal for adult beef cattle, dairy cattle and horses to sufficiently wet the hair, but not to soak the hide. Repeat this application once or twice daily or as needed to give continued protection.

To control the motile stages of blood sucking lice on beef and dairy cattle, apply the diluted spray to thoroughly wet the hair. Use 2 ounces or less per animal and repeat every 2 to 3 weeks as required.

NOTE: Do not spray directly into foodstuffs. Use in food processing plants only when plant is not in operation. Foods should be removed or covered during treatment. All food processing surfaces should be removed or thoroughly cleaned before using. When using the product in these areas, apply only when the facility is not in operation. Do not treat bulk grain products.

Remove pets, birds and cover fish aquariums before spraying.

DIRECTION FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

In Misting Equipment: Use a spraying device such as a cold aerosol generator. We recommend an AERO-FOG or an atomizing sprayer.

To Kill Flies, Mosquitoes, Small Flying Moths and Gnats: Close room, warehouse or other area to be treated and shut off all ventilating systems. Dispense this product as a fine mist. Use dosage of one-half ounce per 1000 cubic feet of room space. Do not remain in treated areas. Leave room closed for half an hour. Ventilate the area after treatment is completed. Repeat application as necessary for insect control.

In Pressurized Tank Sprayers For Wetting Contact Sprays: To kill the listed insects, TETRA-CIDE should be used as follows at a rate of one gallon per 1000 square feet of surface area.

To Kill Cockroaches, Ants and Crickets: Contact as many insects as possible with the spray in addition to thorough spraying of all parts of the room suspected of harbouring these pests. Special attention should be paid to cracks, hidden surfaces under sinks, behind stoves and refrigerators and wherever these pests are suspected of hiding. To kill ants, treat doors, around window frames, ant trails and other areas of entry. Repeat as necessary.

To Kill Carpet Beetles: Directly spray as many insects as possible. Spray both interior and exterior of upholstered furniture. Both top and bottom of rugs and carpets should be sprayed thoroughly. Also treat shelves, closets, areas under furniture and wherever these insects are seen or suspected. Repeat as necessary.

To Kill Exposed Forms of Confused Flour Beetles, Saw-toothed Grain Beetles, and Rice Weevils: Find and destroy infested package foods. Remove all other items from pantry. Spray the shelves to kill any of the named insects present. Place clean paper on the shelves and return packages after shelves have dried. Apply as a coarse wet spray to all other areas infested with these insects. Pay particular attention to cracks and crevices in floors, walls and ceiling. Repeat as necessary.
