**Moths, Roaches, Water Bugs, Bed Bugs, Ants, Fleas, Mosquitoes, Flies,
Carpet Beetles, Silver Fish, Spiders, Wasps, & Certain Weevil & Grain Moths**

To Kill Flies, Mosquitoes, and Wasps: Spray KIL-MOE freely in closed room until filled with mist. Direct spray toward ceiling. Leave room closed 10 to 15 minutes. Open windows, then sweep up dead insects.

To Kill Bed Bugs: Spray both sides of mattresses with KIL-MOE. Force KIL-MOE into seams and tufts. Spray cracks, crevices and baseboards where bugs lodge. Spray bed spring thoroughly and all cracks and crevices in the bedstead.

To Kill Spiders: Spray directly on webs and surrounding areas.

To Kill Carpet Beetles: Spray floors, carpets, floor coverings, following same directions as for moths.

To Kill The Accessible Stages of Weevil and Grain Moths: Spray liberally and thoroughly to ceilings, walls, floors, beams, pipes, joists, partitions, and all interior surfaces of empty bins, chutes, elevator shafts, and storage rooms. Pay particular attention to cracks, crevices, and other hiding places.

CAUTION: Keep out of reach of children.
Harmful if swallowed.

Do not reuse empty container. Return to drum re-
conditioner or destroy by perforating or crushing
and burying in a safe place.

Moths: KIL-MOE will kill moths, larvae, chrysalis, and eggs. KIL-MOE must come in contact with eggs, larvae, and chrysalis. Spray KIL-MOE generously in floor cracks and openings in baseboards. Wet walls and ceiling of closets to be demothed. Clothing to be stored should be cleaned, aired, and sprayed carefully from a distance of 1 to 2 feet. See that seams and folds are wet. Chests and closets should be thoroughly sprayed before being filled with clothes. Clothing in closets or stored in chests which are not moth-tight should be sprayed monthly.

To Kill Fleas: Spray liberally cracks and crevices in flooring and sleeping quarters of pet animals and floor coverings.

To Kill Ants: Spray generously, paying particular attention to runways, window sills, and door treads where ants enter the premises.

To Kill Roaches, Waterbugs, Silverfish: Spray generously around sinks, baseboards, refrigerator, forcing liquid in all cracks and crevices.

Use as a space spray in Food Plants only when not in operation. Foods should be removed or covered during treatment. All food processing surfaces should be covered during treatment or thoroughly cleaned before using. Do not remain in treated area and ventilate the area after treatment is completed.
