DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

CD 1.6 Detergent/Disinfectant is designed to provide effective cleaning, deodorizing, sanitization and disinfection specifically for hospitals, nursing homes, schools, animal quarters, kennels, food processing plants, food service establishments, transportation terminals, office buildings, manufacturing facilities, lodging establishments, retail businesses and athletic/recreational facilities where housekeeping is of prime importance to control the hazard of cross contamination.

When used as directed, this product is formulated to disinfect hard, non-porous, inanimate, environmental surfaces: floors, walls, metal surfaces, stainless steel surfaces, glazed porcelain, glazed ceramic tile, plastic surfaces, bathrooms, shower stalls, bathtubs, cabinets, tables, chairs (non-upholstered surfaces), and telephones. For larger areas: operating rooms, patient care facilities and restrooms, this product is designed to provide both general cleaning and disinfecting.

This product deodorizes those areas which generally are hard to keep fresh smelling, such as garbage storage areas, empty garbage bins and cans, toilet bowls and other areas which are prone to odors caused by microorganisms.

This product is not to be used as a terminal sterilant/high-level disinfectant on any surface or instrument that (1) is introduced directly into the human body either into or in contact with the bloodstream or normally sterile areas of the body, or (2) contacts intact mucous membranes but which does not ordinarily penetrate the blood barrier or otherwise enter normally sterile areas of the body.

ISINFECTION - To disinfect hard, inanimate, non-porous surfaces apply solution with a mop, cloth, sponge or hand pump trigger sprayer so as to wet all surfaces thoroughly. Allow to remain wet for 10 minutes and then let air dry.

GENERAL DISINFECTION - Add 4.5 ounces of this product per gallon of water.

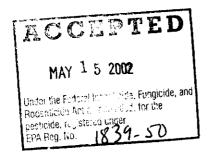
HOSPITAL DISINFECTION - Add 6 ounces of this product per gallon of water.

For heavily soiled areas, a pre-cleaning step is required. Prepare a fresh solution for each use.

To disinfect toilet bowls: Remove gross filth or soils from surfaces with bowl brush. Add 4.5 ounces of this product directly to the bowl water. Brush or swab the bowl completely using a scrub brush or toilet mop, making sure to get under the rim. Let stand for 10 minutes and flush.

To disinfect food processing premises: floors, walls, and storage areas, add 4.5 ounces of this product per gallon of water. For heavily soiled areas, a pre-cleaning step is required. Apply solution with a mop, cloth, sponge or hand pump trigger sprayer so as to wet all surfaces thoroughly. Allow to remain wet for 10 minutes, then remove excess liquid. Before using this product, food products and packaging materials must be removed from the area or carefully protected. After use, all surfaces in the area must be thoroughly rinsed with potable water.

To disinfect food service establishment food contact surfaces: countertops, appliances, tables, add 4.5 ounces of this product per gallon of water. For heavily soiled areas, a pre-cleaning step is required. Apply solution with a cloth, ponge or hand pump trigger sprayer so as to wet all surfaces thoroughly. Allow the surface to remain wet for 10 minutes, then remove excess liquid and rinse the surface with potable water. This product can not be used to clean the following food contact surfaces: utensils, glassware and dishes.

SANITIZATION - Recommended for use in restaurants, dairies, food processing plants, and bars. When used as directed this product is an effective sanitizer against Escherichia coli and Staphylococcus aureus.

Remove all gross food particles and soil from areas which are to be sanitized with a good detergent, pre-flush, pre-soak or pre-scrape treatment. Rinse with a potable water rinse. To sanitize pre-cleaned and potable water-rinsed, non-porous, food contact surfaces, prepare a 200 ppm active quaternary solution by adding 8 ounces of this product to 5 gallons of wa-

To sanitize immobile items such as tanks, chopping blocks and counter tops, flood the area with a 200 ppm active quaternary solution for at least 60 seconds making sure to wet all surfaces completely. To sanitize mobile items such as drinking glasses and eating utensils, immerse in a 200 ppm active quaternary solution for at least 60 seconds making sure to immerse completely. Remove items, drain the use solution from the surface and air dry. Prepare a fresh solution daily or more frequently as soil is apparent. When used for sanitization of previously cleaned food equipment or food contact items, limit the active quaternary to 200 ppm. NO POTABLE WATER RINSE IS REQUIRED. This product is an effective sanitizer when diluted in water up to 500 ppm hardness (CaCO₃).

- 1. Scrape and pre-wash utensils and glasses whenever possible.
- 2. Wash with a good detergent or compatible cleanser.
- 3. Rinse with clean water.
