Directions For Use

Timber should be dry. If necessary to cut wood after treatment swab cut surfaces thoroughly.

FOR TREATING FENCE POSTS:

Fill open barrel with peeled and seasoned posts and pour in preservative until barrel is full. Soak 24 hours, then turn end for end and soak another 24 hours. The posts may be set out any time thereafter. Wear protective clothing and rubber gloves when handling freshly treated lumber.

FOR TERMITES ALREADY IN BUILDING:

Locate and destroy tunnels. Replace badly damaged wood with new treated pieces. Exposed wood should be soaked with preservative by brush or spray, applying generously to joints and cracks. Apply two coats to all wood coming in contact with the soil. Make a trench around foundation and pillars, six inches wide and 30 inches deep or to the top of the footing if shallower. As soil is replaced, add preservative at the rate of 1 gallon to each foot of trench. Up to 15" deep. For trenches shallower than 15" use 1 gal. per 2 linear ft. of trench.
