## ONE QUART MAKES 51/2 GALLONS FINISHED SPRAY

## SHAKE CONTENTS BEFORE USING

FOR DORMANT USE — To control scale insects, red spider mites and mealy bugs on Dormant shrubs, evergreens (note caution\*), Woody Plants, Fruit Trees (apple, plums, pears, apricots, peaches, cherries) and shade trees: Use ½ pint (5½ ozs.) per gallon water.

\*Do not spray foliage within 30 days before or after using sulfur. Do not spray broadleaved evergreens when temperatures are near or below freezing. Dormant oil spray may cause discoloration of Blue Spruce. Do not apply oil when rain ar snow is likely to follow quickly or when the temperature is below 40° F., or is likely to drop to the freezing point before the spray has thoroughly dried. Use the proper amounts only as stated on this label and follow all cautions. Spray thoroughly, wetting insects on both sides of leaves.

CAUTION: HARMFUL IF SWALLOWED — Avoid breathing spray mist. Keep spray out of eyes and wash hands thoroughly immediately after application. Do not store diluted spray. Mix up new batch each time.

Keep out of lakes, streams, or ponds. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment, or disposal of wastes. Apply this product only as specified on this label.

Do not reuse container - Destroy when empty.

Do not use, pour, spill, or store near heat or open flame. 72/2
