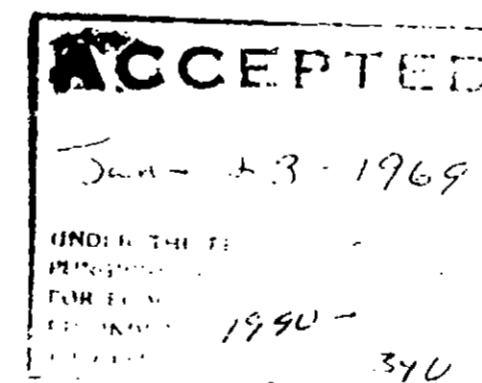

GENERAL INFORMATION

CO-OP Lawn and Garden Weed Killer is a 5% granular formulation for use as a pre-emergence application for control of crabgrass and other annual grasses and certain broadleaf weeds on numerous soils. CO-OP Lawn and Garden Weed Killer is recommended for use on golf courses, flower gardens, nursery stock, streets, and vegetable lawns.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

Follow label directions carefully. For the control of quackgrass and other annual weeds, apply 10 to 15 pounds per acre on sandy and heavy crabgrass, green foxtail, yellow foxtail, leopards, wild rice, and other weeds. For the control of common chickweed, lambsquarters, pigweed, and Florida spurge, CO-OP Lawn and Garden Weed Killer is recommended at the rate of 10 to 15 pounds per acre on 4.0 pounds per 1000 square feet or 1 pound per 100 square feet for 2500 square feet. A slightly higher rate of application, up to 210 pounds per acre of this product may be required for control of hairy wood sorrel, annual bluegrass, ground cherry, jockey, browntop panicum, goosegrass, and other weeds from road, railroad, driveway, and building sprouts.

When CO-OP Lawn and Garden Weed Killer is used at the recommended rate, up to 3 months weed control can be expected. For crabgrass, jockey, and other weeds, control from the other side of the driveway will not be achieved. For weeds that have not been effectively controlled with CO-OP Lawn and Garden Weed Killer.

Spreaders should be checked to determine whether they are applying the correct amount of CO-OP Lawn and Garden Weed Killer. For vegetable crop, the application should be made to a uniform weed free soil surface within 2 to 3 days maximum following cultivation to prevent subsurface germinating weeds from becoming established before the CO-OP Lawn and Garden Weed Killer is activated. Disturbing the soil surface following application will reduce effectiveness. Rates of application can be reduced by banding.

If there is no effective rain within 3 to 4 days after CO-OP Lawn and Garden Weed Killer application, sprinkler irrigation should be used for best results.

CO-OP Lawn and Garden Weed Killer can also be applied by the shaker method. The ideal way of doing this is to measure off the areas to be treated into 10 foot squares and then evenly spread the prescribed quantity of CO-OP Lawn and Garden Weed Killer over this area. 1 pound approximately 1 quart to treat 250 square feet area of 10 feet by 10 feet or 1 quart to treat 50 square feet.

ANY APPLICATION OF DACTHAL SHOULD BE MADE PRIOR TO WEED SEED GERMINATION.

RECOMMENDATIONS

TURF - Apply 10 to 15 pounds per acre at the rate of 1.0 pound per acre in the early spring before crabgrass and other annual grasses and broadleaf weeds germinate. This usually coincides with the time for the first mowing of the lawn. One application applied before weed germination in early spring usually provides season long control. Where spring weeding is necessary, there should be a delay of at least 60 days after the application. Do not apply to dandelions.

Early spring application of CO-OP Lawn and Garden Weed Killer may be applied to newly seeded turf after the established greening of newly sown turf has begun. Early spring applications of CO-OP Lawn and Garden Weed Killer are a fast way to control permanent grasses.
