To Operate. Remove cap, hold bomb in spray position, be sure nozzle opening is directed at area to be sprayed and spray from tank through nozzle and spray infected area until wet. Fill container 4 to 12 in. deep from a water and spray at the rate of 1 in. per sq. and on wet surface are wet.

ANTS, ROACHES, CRICKETS, SILVERFISH, SPIDERS, WATERBUGS. Make up and apply a "poll" treatment to localize and exterminate insects to be killed. Thorough application can be made around baseboards, under doors, window frames, and other places where there is a high concentration of the insects being sprayed.
