DIRECTIONS

FOR SANITIZING DAIRY EQUIPMENT SUCH AS PAILS, STRAINERS, MILKING MACHINE PARTS, HOLDING TANKS, etc., flush equipment with clean, warm (not hot) water then wash and brush in clean, warm water, using a good detergent (not soap). Rinse. Sanitize in CHLORO-SAN solution using one-half level tablespoonful or one heaping teaspoonful of CHLORO-SAN in each three gallons of water. This dilution will give 100 parts per million of available chlorine.

Air dry and protect from dust and dirt.

Immediately before re-using milking equipment, sanitize again with clean CHLORO-SAN solution as above directed.

For washing udders, use the above dilution in warm water and dry well before milking.

This product fulfills the criteria of Appendix F, the Grade "A" Pasteurized Milk Ordinance 1965 recommendations of the U. S. Public Health Service, when tested by Chambers method.

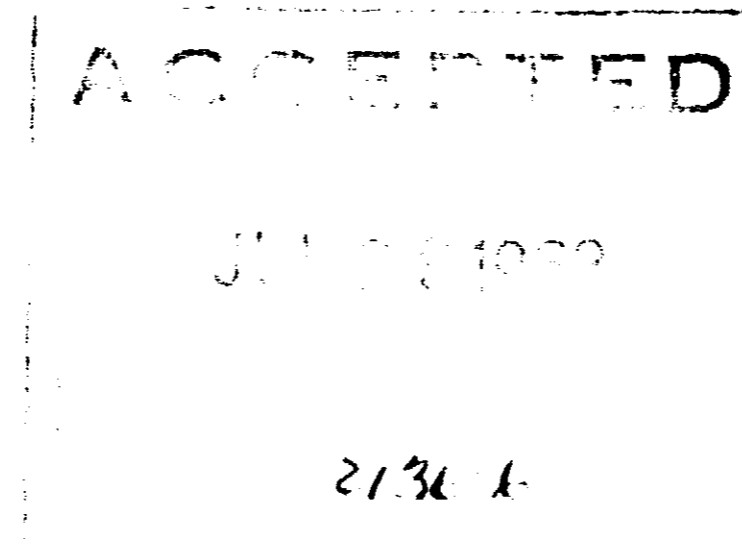
