## DIRECTIONS

BEETS (14), CARROTS (7), LETTUCE (14), SPINACH (14): Web Worm. Flea Beetle, Leafhopper, Harlequin Bug, Lygus and Stink Bugs, Leaf Tiers, Alternaria and Cercospora Leaf Spot of Beets and Carrots, Downy Mildew of Lettuce and Spinach.

BLACKBERRIES (14), RASPBERRIES (14): Japanese Beetle, Leaf Roller, Leafhopper, Aphids, Spittlebug, Anthracnose.

STRAWBERRIES (7): Leaf Roller Meadow Spit tlebug, Strawberry Weevil, Japanese Beetle Botrytis Fruit Rot, Leaf Spot.

GRAPES (7): Leaf Folder, Leafhopper, Leaf Skeletonizer, Berry Moth, Japanese Beetle, Rod-Banded Leaf Roller, Downy Mildew, Black Rot.
