TESTS TO CONTROL FLAME SPREADING (EXCLUDING D.T.V.): To determine flame, smoke, heat, and toxicity, tests are conducted on other materials, such as wood, plastic, and metal. These tests are conducted in a laboratory setting, where the material is exposed to a flame and the resulting flame spread, smoke, heat, and toxicity are measured. The results of these tests are used to determine the fire resistance of the material and to develop fire safety codes and standards.
