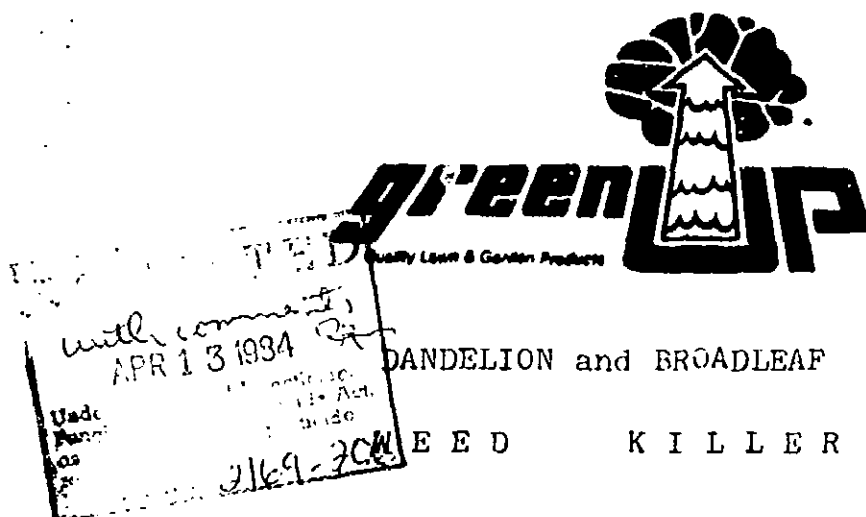

STATEMENTS OF PRACTICAL TREATMENTS

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal Law to use this product in manner inconsistent with its labeling.

GENERAL INFORMATION

This product may be used for the control of broadleaved weeds in lawns, ornamental turf, vacant lots and fence rows. It is most effective when weeds are small and actively growing and should be applied when the temperatures range from 65 degrees to 80 degrees F. Do not apply on a windy day. If applied during extreme temperatures weed control will be erratic. Do not apply if rain is expected in 8 hours. Application may be made with power, knapsack or hand-attached sprayer. Do not treat newly seeded lawns until after first cutting. Make sure to add Patterson's Spreader Sticker to the spray for best weed control. Avoid spray drift to susceptible plants, as this product may injure beans, cucumbers, grapes, corn, tomatoes, and other vegetables, flower and ornamental plants. Coarse sprays applied at low pressure are less likely to drift. Do not exceed prescribed dosage rates. Do not use equipment not for this product to apply insecticides or fungicides to susceptible plants or seeds. Do not use on grass seed crops or on turf containing heat grasses. Do not apply to Dichondra, St. Augustine, Carpet grass or clover lawns. Do not use on new grass seedlings less than two months old. Clover present in turf may be damaged. Do not co-aminate water used for irrigation or domestic purposes.

LAWNS AND ORNAMENTAL TURF: For control of susceptible weeds such as Beggar-Tick, Buckhorn, Heal-all, Horseweed, Annual Morning Glory, Lamb's Quarters, Mustard, Peppercorn, Plantain, Ragwort, Shepherds Purse, and Sunflower use 1 tablespoonful per gallon of water and apply either as a spot spray or overall spray. (One gallon will usually cover about 500 sq. ft. For Hard-to-Kill weeds such as Spurge, Knotweed, and Chickweed repeat as necessary for control.

VACANT LOTS AND SIMILAR NON-CROP AREAS: For broadleaved weed control in these areas use 1 tablespoonful per gallon of water to thoroughly wet all undesirable foliage. One gallon of spray should cover 100 to 500 sq. ft. depending on density of foliage. Make sure to use spreader sticker. Repeat each 2 to 3 weeks as necessary to control any regrowth.

SPOT SPRAYING OF WEEDS: Use a pressure sprayer or a hand gun type sprayer to treat individual weeds at anytime. New grass may be injured in these spots. Add 1 tablespoonful per gallon of water making sure to use a spreader sticker. Wet weeds. Repeat as needed for control.

2. Submit one (1) copy of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment.
