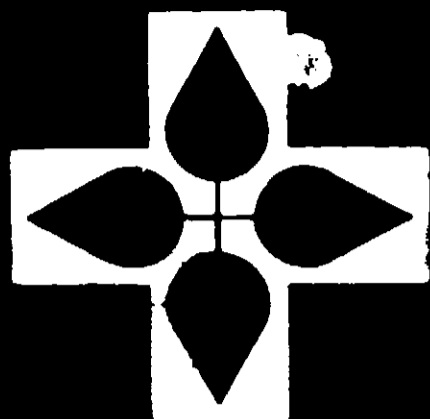

In areas of excessive rainfall (60-80 inches per year), treatment every 6 months may become necessary for grass and weed control. GRASS-N-WEED KILLS OVER 80 DIFFERENT WEED SPECIES COMMONLY FOUND.

HOW TO SPRAY GRASS-N-WEED. Apply diluted spray to areas with a garden sprinkler can or a sprayer that delivers large coarse droplets. Hold sprinkler or nozzle within 6 inches of ground. Do not allow spray to drift. To clean sprinkler can, fill with 1 pint household ammonia and water. Let stand over night, empty and flush. Do not get spray on roots of valuable plants; therefore, do not treat beneath "drip" area of small trees, etc. Do not spray cultivated areas where nearby trees, shrubs or plants may be injured from leaching of chemical in soil. 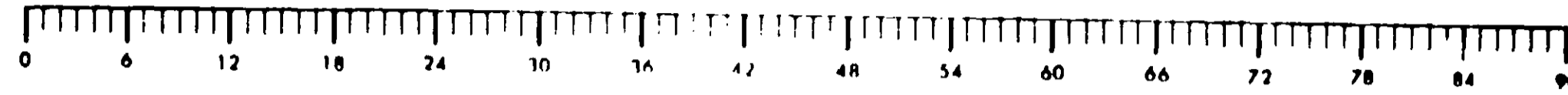
