### PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

#### Hazards to Humans & Animals

**CAUTION:** Harmful if swallowed. Keep out of reach of children and domestic animals. Do not contaminate feed or feeding utensils. Cover or remove feed before spraying. Do not use on meat or dairy animals. Do not wet the animal's skin.

#### STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

**If Swallowed:** Call a physician immediately. Gastric lavage is not indicated if material was taken internally. **DO NOT INDUCE VOMITING** unless other treatment is not available. Vomiting may cause aspiration pneumonia. If it is necessary to induce vomiting, give victim one or two glasses of water and insert finger in back of throat. Repeat until vomit fluid is clear. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

**If Inhaled:** Remove victim to fresh air. Apply respiration if indicated.

**If On Skin:** Wash contaminated skin with soap and water.

**If In Eyes:** Flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention.

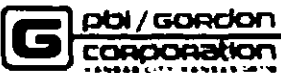

### DIRECTIONS FOR USE (Cont):

**GENERAL:** Horse & Pony Spray is formulated for use on horse and pony show stock. Horse & Pony Spray protects against biting flies and will impart a bright sheen to your animal's coat. Horse & Pony Spray may be misted or wiped on. Use no more than 1 or 2 ounces per animal per day.

**AS A MIST:** Select a hand-sprayer that will deliver a mist. Set the sprayer to the "Fine Mist" position. Do not use coarse sprays. Do not wet the animal's skin. A gentle, fine mist is all that's required. Do not make applications in direct or hot sunlight. Do not use on meat or dairy animals. Use one or two ounces per animal per day. After application, brush the coat to give overall coverage. Make sure legs and ankles are treated. For face area, treat as a wipe-on application. Also, spray adjacent stable areas for more effective fly control.

**TO WIPE-ON:** Do not wet the animal's skin. Rub the animal down and remove dirt. Mist a small amount (1 Oz.) into a soft cloth and wipe on against the hair grain. Make sure to treat legs, belly, neck, face and back line. Afterward, brush the coat to bring out a bright sheen. Repeat as needed to kill and repel biting flies. During fly-time, best protection will be given by treating animals 3 to 4 times each week.

**NOTE:** Remember, only a small amount per animal is needed per day. As a mist, set your sprayer to the "Fine Mist" position only and brush across the coat to achieve overall coverage. As a wipe-on, lightly mist a small amount onto a soft cloth and wipe against the hair grain. Brushing afterward will bring out a bright sheen to the animal's coat.

The objective is to create a barrier on the hair that will both repel and kill biting flies. Precautions should be taken to avoid any wetting of the animal's skin.
