Subject: EPA Reg. 2217-488 / Trimec 873 Herbicide / RED Label Amendment: 2,4-D

The labeling referred to above is in compliance with the 2,4-D RED and is amended under the RED provided that you:

- 1) Submit and/or cite all data required for registration/reregistration review of your product when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit data.
- 2) Please note: Final product reregistration can't be considered until after all active ingredients in this product are eligible for reregistration.
- 3) Per the acute toxicity review, the Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals must be revised to read:

“DANGER

Corrosive. Causes irreversible eye damage. Harmful if swallowed. Harmful if absorbed through skin. Do not get in eyes, on skin, or on clothing.”

- 4) Per the acute toxicity review, since gloves are required for all handlers, the text “(except for applicators using ground boom equipment)” must be deleted from the glove statement.

- 5) The first sentence of the Environmental Hazard section must be revised to read:

“This pesticide *is* toxic to fish and aquatic invertebrates and may adversely affect non-target plants.”

- 6) On page 3, under Application Rates and to table 1 change “recommendations” to “specifications”.

- 7) To the label add “Do not make more than 2 applications per year, including spot treatments made in combination with broadcast applications” to comply with the dicamba RED.

- 8) To the Warranty statement add “to the extent consistent with applicable law” in front of “the


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exclusive remedy”.

9) To the label add “Use of this product in certain portions of California, Oregon, and Washington is subject to the January 22, 2004 Order for injunctive relief in Washington Toxics Coaliton, et. al. v. EP, C01-0132C, (W.D. WA). For further information, please refer to <http://www.epa.gov/espp/>”.

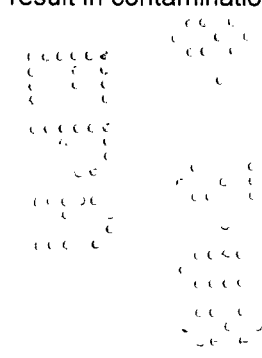

Environmental Hazards

This pesticide may be toxic to fish and aquatic invertebrates and may adversely affect non-target plants. Do not apply directly to water, to areas where surface water is present, or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Drift and runoff may be hazardous to aquatic organisms in water adjacent to treated areas. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment wash waters or rinsate.

- Do not enter or allow people (or pets) to enter the treated area until sprays have dried.
- Do not apply this product in a way that will contact workers or other persons, either directly or through drift. Only protected handlers may be in the area during application.

SITES

Not for use on turf being grown for sale or other commercial use as sod, or for commercial seed production, or for research purposes.

This product is intended to be applied by lawn care operators and landscape personnel for use in ornamental lawns and turf established in institutional, ornamental, and residential/domestic sites. Institutional sites are defined as turf areas around properties or facilities providing a service to public or private organizations including, but not limited to, hospitals, nursing homes, schools, museums, libraries, sport facilities, golf courses, and office buildings. Ornamental sites include turfgrass established around residences, parks, streets, retail outlets, cemeteries, industrial and institutional buildings. Finally, residential/domestic sites are defined as areas associated with the household or home life including, but not limited to apartment complexes, condominiums, and patient care areas of nursing homes, mental institutions, hospitals, or convalescent homes.

APPLICATION SCHEDULES

Apply this product to emerged broadleaf weeds that are actively growing. Sequential or follow-up applications may be required for dense infestations of perennial and biennial weeds. If required, the treatment interval between the first and second application should be 30 days.

APPLICATION RATES

Dosage rates and spray volume recommendations of this product are presented in Table 1.

Generally, the lower application rates within the specified range will provide satisfactory control of sensitive weed species. The higher application rates within the specified range will be required for dense infestations of perennial weeds, for adverse/extreme environmental conditions, or for weeds beyond the appropriate growth stages.

Limitations on spot treatments for ornamental turfgrass:

Spot treatment is defined as a treatment area no greater than 1,000 sq.ft. per acre. The maximum application rate is 1.47 fl.oz. per 1,000 sq.ft. per application (0.41 lbs MCPP-p acid equivalent per acre).

USE PRECAUTIONS:

- Do not apply this product through any type of irrigation system.
- Do not use this product on or near desirable plants, including contact of spray on exposed root systems or adventitious shoots within the drip line of desirable trees and shrubs, since injury may result.
- Do not spray on St Augustinegrass, centipedegrass, carpetgrass, dichondra, nor on lawns or turf where desirable clovers are present.
- Do not exceed specified dosages for any area.
- Do not apply to newly seeded grasses until well established.
- Do not broadcast apply when air temperatures exceed 85°F; some injury may be expected with spot treatments when air temperatures exceed 85°F.
- Seed can be sown 3 to 4 weeks after application at recommended rates.
- After using this product, clean sprayer with Gordon's Spray Tank Cleaner and water, and rinse thoroughly before applying other pesticides.

Spray Drift Management

A variety of factors including weather conditions (e.g., wind direction, wind speed, temperature, relative humidity) and method of ground application can influence pesticide drift. The applicator must evaluate all factors and make appropriate adjustments when applying this product.

Droplet Size

Use only Medium or coarser spray nozzles according to ASAE (S 572) definition of standard nozzles or a volume mean diameter of 300 microns or greater for spinning atomizer nozzles.

Wind Speed

Do not apply at wind speeds greater than 10 mph. Only apply this product if the wind direction favors on-target deposition and there are not sensitive areas (including, but not limited to, bodies of water, known habitat for nontarget species, nontarget crops) within 250 feet downwind.

Temperature Inversions

If applying at wind speeds less than 3 mph, the applicator must determine if: a) conditions of temperature inversion exist, or b) stable atmospheric conditions exist at or below nozzle height. Do not make applications into areas of temperature inversions or stable atmospheric conditions.

Susceptible Plants

Do not apply under circumstances where spray drift may occur to food, forage, or other plantings that might be damaged or crops thereof rendered unfit for sale, use or consumption. Susceptible crops include, but are not limited to, cotton, okra, flowers, grapes (in growing stage), fruit trees (foliage),

soybeans (vegetative stage), ornamentals, sunflowers, tomatoes, beans, and other vegetables, or tobacco. Small amounts of spray drift that might not be visible may injure susceptible broadleaf plants.

Other State and Local Requirements

Applicators must follow all state and local pesticide drift requirements regarding application of 2,4-D herbicides. Where states have more stringent regulations, they must be observed.

Equipment

All ground application equipment must be properly maintained and calibrated using appropriate carriers or surrogates.

Do not apply with a nozzle height greater than 4 feet above the crop canopy.
