PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

Hazards to Humans & Domestic Animals

CAUTION: Harmful if swallowed. Avoid contact with eyes, skin or clothing. In case of contact, flush eyes with plenty of water. Get medical attention. Avoid contamination of food or feedstuffs.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

STORAGE: Keep from freezing. Store in original container in a locked storage area inaccessible to children and pets. Do not store near food or feedstuffs. To prevent contamination, do not store near fertilizers, insecticides, fungicides, or near seeds.

PRODUCT DISPOSAL: Completely wrap original container with unused product in several layers of newspapers and discard in trash.

CONTAINER DISPOSAL: Do not reuse empty container. Rinse thoroughly before discarding in trash.

OTHER USE PRECAUTIONS: Do not allow spray to drift onto vegetables, flowers, ornamental plants, shrubs, trees and other desirable plants since injury may result. Do not pour spray solutions near these plants. Whether using a hose and sprayer or pressure sprayer, do not use sprays that are fine because they can drift and cause damage to non-target plants. Coarse droplet sprays are less likely to drift. Use only lawn type sprayers. Do not spray on carpetgrass, dichondra, or on areas where desirable clovers are present. Do not spray roots of trees and shrubs. Do not exceed specified dosages for any area. Be particularly careful within dripline of tree and other ornamental species. This product may be injurious to St. Augustine and Centipede grasses. Since injury can be expected, spot spray weeds only with a pressure sprayer. Do not apply this product through any type of irrigation system.

WHERE TO USE:

BL 6000 Lawn Weed Killer may be used on Bahia, Bermuda, Bluegrass, Fescue, Rye or Zoysia lawns, vacant lots, playgrounds and other similar areas where broadleaf weeds are present. This product is especially effective on all hard-to-kill weeds such as Poison Ivy, Poison Oak, Sheep Sorrel and Spurge. In addition, BL 6000 Lawn Weed Killer controls most other broadleaf weeds including sensitive weeds such as Chickweed, Clover, Dandelion, Knotweed and Plantain. A partial list is given on the next panel.

This product is designed for use through the attached sprayer for controlling of broadleaf lawn weeds.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE ON LAWNS

For control of dandelions, chickweed, plantains, clover and other listed weeds apply when weeds are actively growing. Spray weeds such as wild garlic and wild onions when they appear in late fall and again in early spring. Water lawn thoroughly 1 to 2 days before application. Do not water for 48 hours after application. Do not mow for one week before treating. Spray entire lawn, wetting weeds and lawn grasses, do not saturate. Spray when air is calm to avoid spray drift that might injure desirable ornamental plants. Adjust water pressure at faucet to give coarse spray, which is less likely to drift. Do not apply when temperatures are expected to exceed 85°F within 24 hours following application. Temporary injury may occur on Bent, Bermuda, Red Fescue, Centipede and Carpetgrasses. DO NOT apply to Dichondra, Lippia or Augustine and Clover lawns.

HOW TO USE

Shake well before using. Connect attached spray nozzle and siphon tube to garden hose. Remove seal from top of sprayer and fold down to front of sprayer. Remove child-resistant cap from bottle. Attach bottle to spray nozzle. Turn the ON/OFF valve on top of spray nozzle to the "OFF" position. Turn on water at faucet. Extend hose to the farthest area of lawn to be treated and work back towards faucet so that you do not walk over treated areas.

To begin spraying, point spray nozzle towards lawn and turn the valve to the "ON" position. The water automatically mixes with the product. Walk at a steady pace while spraying using an even, sweeping motion, slightly overlapping treated areas. Refer to graduated scale on side of container to guide coverage (example: when bottle is half empty, 2,500 sq. ft. of area (25' x 100') should have been covered). To stop spraying, turn spray nozzle to the "OFF" position and turn off water at faucet. To relieve pressure, turn valve to the "ON" position and point sprayer away from any desirable plants. After removing nozzle from hose, replace original cap seal to store any product remaining.

NEWLY SEEDING LAWNS: Do not apply after they have been mowed at least three times.

WHEN TO USE

1. Spray at a rate of 1 quart per 5,000 sq. ft. when weeds are actively growing.
2. On new lawns, wait until the grass has reached a height of 2 inches before making an overall spray treatment. For a spot treatment, it may be made at any time with a small pressure sprayer, spraying only the weeds at ground level. Wait 3 weeks before putting new grass seed or sod down in the bare.

- Poor weed control may result if spray is applied during drought, or just before rain.
- For best results, mow before treating.
- Do not water lawn within 24 hours after treatment.

HOW TO APPLY:

Shake well before applying.

Connect spray nozzle to hose. Remove bottle cap and screw bottle onto nozzle. Turn the ON/OFF switch on top of the nozzle right to left to OFF. Turn on the water at the tap. When ready to treat, turn the ON/OFF switch to its center ON position. The water mixes automatically with the product at the proper ratio. Walk and spray at a steady pace. Each mark on the side of bottle covers 1,000 to 1,200 square feet.

HOW MUCH TO USE (Entire lawn):

HOSE-END SPRAYER: Use a hose-end designed for lawns. Full recommended amount of product (Column 1) in bottle and add water to indicated level (Column 2) and spray on area shown in Column 3. For example, to spray 1,900 sq. ft. measure 10-12 oz. in jar, add water to the 10 gallon level, and mix. Turn on hose and spray as evenly as possible over 1,900 sq. ft.

PRESSURE-SPRAYERS: Measure indicated amount of BL 6000 Lawn Weed Killer into tank and dilute with water according to the following chart. Use a spray pattern that gives small spray droplets without any fine mist, and cover the area indicated.

SPOT-SPRAYING: To spray small areas or individual weeds, do not use a hose-end sprayer. Mix 1 oz. (2 Tbsp.) in 1/2 gallon of water in a pressure sprayer and spray as required, being certain to "wet" each weed.

GENERAL BRUSH CONTROL:

For control of brush along roads and other similar non-crop areas mix 10 oz. to 14 oz. in 3 gallons of water and apply over 1,000 sq. ft. Use the higher rate for larger or more dense brush stands. Best results are obtained when brush is young and actively growing. Do not cut brush until the chemical has translocated throughout the plant causing root death. Keep out of lakes, streams and ponds.

HARDY WEEDS:

For hardy weeds such as Clover, Ground Ivy, Oxalis, Sheep Sorrel, Dock, Thistles and Morning Glory in lawns and other areas, repeat application in two to three weeks if necessary.

To begin spraying, point spray nozzle towards lawn and turn the water control valve to the "ON" position. The water automatically mixes with the product. Walk at a steady pace while spraying using an even sweeping motion, slightly overlapping treated areas. Refer to graduated scale on side of container to guide coverage (example: when bottle is half empty, 2,500 sq. ft. of area (25' x 100') should have been covered).

To stop spraying, turn water control valve to the "OFF" position and turn off water at faucet. To relieve pressure, turn water control valve to the "ON" position and point sprayer away from any desirable plants before removing nozzle from hose. Replace original cap/seal to store any product remaining. For storage, rotate small product control valve back to closed position.

NEWLY SEEDED LAWNS may be treated after they have been mowed at least three times.
