



DIRECTIONS FOR USE

WHERE TO USE: Chickweed Killer may be used on Bluegrass, Bermuda, or Zoysia lawns, vacant lots, playgrounds and other similar areas where hard-to-kill weeds are present. This product, while especially effective on all types of CHICKWEED, also gives excellent control of other hard-to-kill weeds such as HENBIT, KNOTWEED, SPOTTED SPURGE, OXALIS, BLACK MEDIC, and SHEEP SORREL. In addition to these, Chickweed Killer controls most broadleafed lawn weeds, and a partial list is given on the side panel. Do not allow spray to get on vegetable or ornamental plants since injury may result. Since injury can be expected when used on Centipede or St. Augustine grass lawns, "Spot-Spray" weeds only. Clover present will be damaged if sprayed.

WHEN TO USE: Spray at any time during the growing season when weeds are actively growing. Treat Chickweed, Henbit, Wild Onion and Garlic in the fall or in the spring, as needed.
