Gordon's Trimec Weed and Feed 24 EPA Registration Number: 2217-581 Your Submission Dated August 12, 1999

The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable. A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records. Submit one copy of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment.

The Agency has recently revised its recommended First Aid statements for pesticide products and intends to issue a PR Notice announcing the changes in the near future. In the interim we are encouraging registrants to begin using the new statements. The new statements were developed as part of the Consumer Labeling Initiative in close cooperation with poison control center personnel and other medical experts. While it is not mandatory that you revise your label at this time, you are strongly encouraged to substitute the revised statements (see next page) for those statements currently on the label at your next label printing



PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

WHERE TO USE:

Gordon's Supreme is a Trimec® brand herbicide containing fertilizer, 2,4-D, mecoprop, and dicamba. This granular weed and feed provides plant nutrients and controls a broad spectrum of broadleaf weeds in turfgrass. Supplemental nitrogen, phosphorus, and potash should be applied according to soft tests or State Extension Service recommendations.

Gordon's Supreme is intended to be applied by commercial applicators, noncommercial users, fawn care operators, and landscape personnel. Cool season and warm season grasses established in institutional, ornamental, and residential sites may be treated.



Institutional sites are defined as turf areas around properties or facilities providing a service to public or private organizations; for example, hospitals, nursing homes, schools, museums, libraries, sport facilities (including golf courses) and office buildings may be treated. Ornamental sites include turfgrass established around residences, parks, streets, retail outlets, cemeteries, and institutional buildings.

Finally, residential sites are defined as areas associated with the household or home life including, but not limited to apartment complexes, condominiums, and patient care areas of nursing homes, mental institutions, hospitals, or convalescent homes.

Gordon's Supreme may be applied to newly seeded cool season turfgrass. Applications are recommended only after the third mowing or after the grass seedlings have tillered and have developed an adequate secondary root system.

Gordon's Supreme may be applied to newly established warm season turfgrass. Treatments should be delayed until 3 to 4 weeks after the sodding, sprigging, or plugging operations, and low application rates (½ of the recommendation for established turfgrass) are suggested.

A uniform broadcast distribution of product on the treated area is essential. Do not exceed the specified application rate for any area and use care in the application of this product within the dripline of trees, shrubs, and other ornamentals.

Do not use this product on dichondra, carpetgrass, St. Augustinegrass, closely-mowed bentgrass putting greens, or turf containing desirable clovers.

WEEDS CONTROLLED:

Dandelion, chickweed, plantain, and clover are controlled effectively with Gordon's Supreme. A partial list of susceptible weeds is shown below:

HOW MUCH TO APPLY:

For Kentucky Bluegrass, Fescue spp., Perennial Ryegrass, Bermudagrass, and Zoysiagrass - Apply 139 - 218 pounds of Gordon's Supreme per acre of established turfgrass. Or the equivalent application rate is 3.2 - 5.0 pounds of product per 1,000 square feet of turfgrass.

Generally, the lower application rates within the specified range will provide satisfactory control of sensitive weed species. The higher application rates within the specified range will be required for dense infestations of perennial weeds, for adverse/extreme environmental conditions, or for weeds beyond the appropriate growth stages.

The maximum application rate to turf is 1.2 pounds 2,4-D acid equivalent per acre per application per site. The maximum number of broadcast applications per treatment site is 2 per year.

Sequential or follow-up applications may be required for dense infestations of perennial and biennial weeds. Also, adverse environmental conditions prior or after application may reduce the effectiveness. If required, the treatment interval between the first and second applications should be approximately 30 days.

Drop spreaders, rotary spreaders, and other granular equipment should be calibrated for accurate and uniform applications of this product. Calibrate the equipment by applying the product over a measured or known area and adjust the equipment according to the recommendations of the equipment manufacturer.





Refer to the rate table for the appropriate bag sizes and the area to be treated.

Note to Supplemental Registrants: Select the appropriate bag size and present only the information provided for that bag size on your product labeling.



Optional: Equipment settings of drop spreaders, rotary spreaders, and other granular applicators may be presented on the container labels as requested by supplemental registrants.

APPLICATION SUGGESTIONS:

- 1. Spring and fall applications are recommended for the best control. However, Gordon's Supreme can be applied any time broadleaf weeds are present and actively growing.
- 2. Mow the turfgrass 2 to 3 days before application.
- 3. Water the turfgrass thoroughly (>½ inch) at least 1 to 2 days before application.
- 4. Schedule applications in the morning when dew is present. Or sprinkle or irrigate lightly (<¼ inch) before application to provide maximum control.
- 5. Rainfall or irrigation within 24 hours after application may reduce the effectiveness. Do not irrigate or water the turfgrass within 24 hours after application.


