

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

Hazards to Humans & Domestic Animals

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS:

This product is toxic to aquatic invertebrates. Drift or runoff may adversely affect aquatic invertebrates and nontarget plants. STORAGE & DISPOSAL

Do not use on warm season grasses, such as St. Augustinegrass, centipedegrass, dichondra, or on lawns and turf where desirable clovers are present. *NOTE:* Coarse sprays are less likely to drift. Do not spray roots of trees and ornamentals. Do not exceed specified dosages for any area; be particularly careful within the dripline of tree and other ornamental species. Do not broadcast apply when air temperatures exceed 85°F; some injury may be expected with spot treatments when air temperatures exceed 85°F. Seed can be sown 3 to 4 weeks after application. GENERAL INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS:

DM 896 is a selective herbicide for the control of broadleaf weeds in bluegrass, fescue, bermudagrass, and bentgrass turf. Do not use this product on closely-mowed bentgrass or bermudagrass as on golf greens or tees. Weeds are best controlled when they are young and actively growing.

WEEDS CONTROLLED:

Susceptible -- dandelion, clover, common chickweed, mouseear chickweed, plantain, pigweed, ragweed and lambsquarters.

Moderately Susceptible -- knotweed, black medic, English daisy, dock, purslane, oxalis, mallow.

APPLICATION RATE:

For established turf, apply 1 to $1\frac{1}{4}$ fluid ounces for 1,000 square feet ($2\frac{2}{3}$ pints to $3\frac{1}{3}$ pints per acre) in 1 to 2 gallons of water per 1,000 square feet (40 to 80 gallons per acre). Use higher rates when hard-to-kill weeds are present. Maximum control of weeds will be obtained from spring or early fall applications when weeds are actively growing. Avoid applying during periods when turf is under stress from drought or extreme heat. Do not water for 24 hours after application. Do not apply to newly seeded turf until after the second or third mowing.

The maximum application rate to turf is 0.9 pounds 2,4-D acid equivalent per acre oer application per site. The maximum number of broadcast applications per treatment site is 2 per year.

NOTE: Use application equipment that is capable of applying uniform droplets over the entire area to be covered.
