EH1314 Herbicide

EPA Reg. No. 2217-814

The labeling referred to above is in compliance with the 2,4-D RED and are amended under the RED provided that you:

- 1. Submit and/or cite all data required for registration/reregistration review of your product when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit data.
- 2. Make the following changes to the product labeling:
 - a. The Agency recommends that additional text be added to the <u>Note to Physician</u> which addresses category I eye irritation concerns. The following statements are some suggested types of information that could be included, if applicable:
 - -technical information on symptomatology;
 - -use of supportive treatments to maintain life functions;
 - -medicine that will counteract the specific physiological effects of the pesticide;
 - -company telephone number to specific medical personnel who can provide specialized medical advice
 - b. This product is a wettable powder and therefore, must be packaged in water-soluble packets (WSP) as required by the 2,4-D RED.

This product must also be contained in child resistant packaging.

c. Immediately following the <u>Personal Protective Equipment</u> heading, add the text "(PPE)."

- d. Revise the PPE "protective eyewear" to read "Goggles or facesheild"
- e. The following Engineering Controls text must be added to the label:

"Water-soluble packets when used correctly qualify as a closed loading system under the WPS. Mixers and loaders using water-soluble packets (1) must wear the PPE specified above for mixers and loaders and (2) must be provided, have immediately available for use in an emergency, such as a broken package, spill, or equipment breakdown a NIOSH-approved dust mist filtering respirator with MSHA/NIOSH approval number prefix TC-21C or a NIOSH-approved respirator with any N, R, P, or HE filter."

- f. Revise the first sentence of the <u>Environmental Hazards</u> section to read: "This pesticide is toxic to fish and aquatic invertebrates and may adversely affect non-target plants."
- g. For the <u>Spray Drift Management</u> section, add the following as the last sentence to the Wind Speed paragraph:

"If applying a medium spray, leave one swath unsprayed at the downwind edge of the treated area."

- h. Under the <u>Limitations on Broadcast Applications to Ornamental Turfgrass</u> table (footnote), either delete the text "excluding spot treatments" or specify the spot treatment application restrictions per the MCPP-p RED.
- i. Per the product chemistry review, the subheading "Storage" in the <u>Storage and Disposal</u> section should be revised to read "**Pesticide Storage**."
- j. Water-soluble packets allow for less restrictive <u>container disposal language</u>. Per the Label Review Manual (Chapter 13, table 4), revise the container disposal language to the following:

"Container Disposal: Nonrefillable container. Do not reuse or refill this container. Offer for recycling, if available or, dispose of the empty outer foil pouch in the trash as long as WSP is unbroken"

3. Please Note: Final product reregistration cannot be considered until after all active ingredients in this product are eligible for reregistration.

Not for use on turf being grown for sale or other commercial use as sod, or for commercial seed production, or for research purposes.

SITES:

EH1314 Herbicide is intended to be applied by lawn care operators, maintenance applicators, and service technicians for use in ornamental lawns and turf established in ornamental sites. Residential and institutional sites include turfgrass established around residences, parks, streets, retail outlets, cemeteries, industrial and institutional buildings. Cool season turfgrass species include Kentucky bluegrass, perennial ryegrass, and the fescues. Warm season turfgrass species include bermudagrass and zoysiagrass.

MIXING INSTRUCTIONS WITH WATER AS THE CARRIER:

- 1. Fill the spray tank with 1/2 to 3/4 of the required amount of water and begin agitation. Sufficient agitation during mixing and application is essential.
- 2. Add EH1314 Herbicide into the spray tank and maintain continuous agitation to avoid separation.
- 3. Fill the spray tank to 3/4 of the required amount of water. If tank mixtures are being prepared, add the companion product when the spray tank is approximately 3/4 full.
- 4. Finally, add the balance of the required water volume and maintain agitation prior to and during the application.

APPLICATION RATES FOR ORNAMENTAL TURFGRASS:

For Kentucky bluegrass, Fescue spp., Perennial Ryegrass, Bermudagrass and Zoysiagrass - Apply 2.20 to 3.30 pounds of product per acre per application with spray volumes ranging from 20 to 220 gallons per acre.

ae = Acid Equivalent. Do not exceed the maximum seasonal rate of 6.6 pounds (3.0 lb 2,4-D ae), 0.74 lb. MCPP-p ae and 0.15 lb dicamba ae) per acre per season, excluding spot treatments.

USE PRECAUTIONS:

Do not apply this product through any type of irrigation system. Do not use this product on or near desirable plants, including within the drip line of the roots of desirable trees and shrubs, since injury may result.

Do not spray on carpetgrass, dichondra, nor on lawns or turf where desirable clovers are present.

Do not exceed specified dosages for any area. Do not apply to newly seeded grasses until well established. Do not broadcast apply when air temperatures exceed 85°F; some injury may be expected with spot treatments when air temperatures exceed 85°F. Seed can be sown 3 to 4 weeks after application at recommended rates.

Spray Drift Management

A variety of factors including weather conditions (e.g., wind direction, wind speed, temperature, relative humidity) and method of ground application can influence pesticide drift. The applicator must evaluate all factors and make appropriate adjustments when applying this product.

Droplet Size

Use only Medium or coarser spray nozzles according to ASAE (S 572) definition of standard nozzles or a volume mean diameter of 300 microns or greater for spinning atomizer nozzles.

Wind Speed

Do not apply at wind speeds greater than 10 mph. Only apply this product if the wind direction favors ontarget deposition and there are not sensitive areas (including, but not limited to, residential areas, bodies of water, known habitat for nontarget species, nontarget crops) within 250 feet downwind.

Temperature Inversions

If applying at wind speeds less than 3 mph, the applicator must determine if: a) conditions of temperature inversion exist, or b) stable atmospheric conditions exist at or below nozzle height. Do not make applications into areas of temperature inversions or stable atmospheric conditions.

Susceptible Plants

Do not apply under circumstances where spray drift may occur to food, forage, or other plantings that might be damaged or crops thereof rendered unfit for sale, use or consumption. Susceptible crops include, but are not limited to, cotton, okra, flowers, grapes (in growing stage), fruit trees (foliage), soybeans (vegetative stage), ornamentals, sunflowers, tomatoes, beans, and other vegetables, or tobacco. Small amounts of spray drift that might not be visible may injure susceptible broadleaf plants.

Other State and Local Requirements

Applicators must follow all state and local pesticide drift requirements regarding application of 2,4-D herbicides. Where states have more stringent regulations, they must be observed.

Equipment

All ground application equipment must be properly maintained and calibrated using appropriate carriers or surrogates.

Do not apply with a nozzle height greater than 4 feet above the crop canopy.
