Established turf of Kentucky bluegrass, fescues, and perennial ryegrass may be treated. Established turf of bermudagrass, zoysiagrass, St. Augustinegrass, and centipedegrass may be treated. A second or follow-up application may be required for dense infestations of weeds or for adverse seasonal conditions. The second application of 3.0 to 4.0 pounds of product per 1,000 square feet should be used 30 days after the first application. Do not apply this product to 'Floratam' St. Augustinegrass in Florida.

The maximum application rate to turf is 1.0 pound 2,4-D acid equivalent per acre per application per site. The maximum number of broadcast applications per treatment site is 2 per year.
