After 18 months, you may only distribute or sell this product if it bears this new revised labeling or subsequently approved labeling. "To distribute or sell" is defined under FIFRA section 2(gg) and its implementing regulation at 40 CFR 152.3.

#### **Environmental Hazards**

### 1. Use Restrictions

- Do not apply this product in a way that will contact any person or pet, either directly or through drift. Keep people and pets out of the area during application.
- Do not allow people or pets to enter the treated area until sprays have dried.
- Do not apply as a fine mist because of potential for injury to desirable plants.
- Do not use this product on or near desirable plants, including contact of spray on exposed root systems or adventitious shoots within the drip line of desirable trees and shrubs, since injury may result.
- Do not apply directly to or near water, storm drains, gutters, sewers, or drainage ditches. Do not apply within 25 feet of rivers, fish ponds, lakes, streams, reservoirs, marshes, estuaries, bays, and oceans. Do not apply when windy. To prevent product run-off, do not over water the treated area(s) to the point of runoff or apply when raining or when rain is expected that day. Rinse applicator over lawn area only.
- Do not apply this product to carpetgrass, dichondra, food crops (gardens, fruits and vegetables), forage crops, or ornamental plants including flowers, trees, shrubs, hedges, woody ornamentals, groundcovers established in landscape plantings, and other nontarget plants.

#### 2. Where To Use

EH-1446 Herbicide is intended for use only on residential [home] lawns including Kentucky Bluegrass, Perennial Ryegrass, Fescues, Common Bermudagrass, Hybrid Bermudagrass, Bahiagrass, Bentgrass, Buffalograss, Centipedegrass, Zoysiagrass, and St. Augustinegrass (except 'Floratam').

#### 3. How Much To Apply

For Bentgrass, Hybrid Bermudagrass, Buffalograss, St. Augustinegrass (except 'Floratam'), and Centipedegrass: Use 2 fl.oz. [(4 Tbsp)] per 1000 sq.ft.

For Kentucky Bluegrass, Fescues, Perennial Ryegrass, Bahiagrass, Common Bermudagrass, and Zoysiagrass: Use 4 fl.oz. [(8 Tbsp)] per 1000 sq.ft.

**Limitations on broadcast applications to residential turfgrass:** The maximum application rate is 4 fl.oz. of product per 1000 sq.ft. per application [0.45 lb 2,4-D ae, 0.08 lb MCPP-p ae, 0.05 lb dicamba ae, and 0.03 lb carfentrazone-ethyl per acre per application]. The maximum number of broadcast applications is limited to 2 per year with a minimum of 30 days between applications. The maximum seasonal rate is 8 fl.oz. of product per 1000 sq.ft. [0.90 lb 2,4-D ae, 0.16 lb MCPP-p ae, 0.10 lb dicamba ae, and 0.05 lb carfentrazone-ethyl per acre per year].

#### 4. How To Apply

#### [4.1 Option 1]

[USING THE READY SPRAY NOZZLE] [Hose End Sprayer Instructions]

- 1. Shake container well before using.
- 2. Connect a garden hose to the Ready Spray nozzle. Make sure the dial on the nozzle is in the "OFF" position with the [green] safety tab in the valve notch.
- 3. Turn on water at faucet. Extend hose to the farthest area to be treated and work back toward the faucet so you don't come in contact with the treated area.
- 4. To BEGIN spraying, point nozzle toward treatment site and a.) bend the [green] safety tab back (located at right of yellow dial) with your thumb, b.) hold while turning yellow dial clockwise until it stops. Water will automatically mix with the product.
- 5. Spray until wet to control weeds. Walk at a steady pace while spraying using an even sweeping motion, slightly overlapping treated areas.
- 6. To STOP spraying, QUICKLY turn the dial counter clockwise until it stops and the safety tab engages into the notch on the valve. Turn water off at faucet. To relieve pressure before removing nozzle from hose, bend the safety tab back and turn dial "ON" until water stops spraying.
- 7. To STORE unused product, make sure the dial is in the "OFF" position with [green] safety tab in the valve notch. Place in cool area away from heat, sunlight or open flame.]

### [4.2 Option 2]

USING THE READY SPRAY NOZZLE]

- 1. Shake container well before using.
- 2. Connect a garden hose to the Ready Spray nozzle. Make sure lever is fully forward in the "OFF" position.
- 3. Turn on water at faucet. Extend hose to the farthest area to be treated and work back toward the faucet so you don't come in contact with the treated area.
- 4. To BEGIN spraying, point nozzle toward treatment site and pull lever backwards towards hose connection. Water will automatically mix with the product.
- 5. Spray until wet to control weeds. Walk at a steady pace working back towards the faucet while spraying using an even sweeping motion, slightly overlapping treated areas.

- 6. To STOP spraying, push lever forward toward nozzle until water flow stops. Turn water off at faucet. To relieve pressure before removing nozzle from hose, pull lever backwards towards hose connection until water stops spraying.
- 7. To STORE unused product, make sure lever is fully forward in the "OFF" position. Place in cool area away from heat, sunlight or open flame.

#### 5. Use Precautions

- Apply when weeds are young and actively growing.
- Apply when daytime temperatures are below 90°F.
- Apply this product to newly seeded grasses when well-established (approximately 6 weeks after seedling emergence) or after the third mowing.
- Apply this product 3 to 4 weeks after the sodding, sprigging, or plugging operations.
- Treated areas may be reseeded at 2 weeks after the application of this product.
- Adequate soil moisture and favorable growing conditions enhance the performance of this product. If dry conditions exist, schedule irrigation (watering) before and after the application. Avoid applications of this product when turf is under stress since injury may result.
- Avoid mowing within 1 to 2 days before and after the application of this product.
- It is the responsibility of the applicator to avoid spray drift at the application site. Do not allow the herbicide solution to mist, drip, drift, or splash onto desirable broadleaf plants, as small amounts of this product can damage sensitive plants near the treated area. If desirable plants are accidentally sprayed, immediately rinsing leaves with water may reduce or eliminate plant damage.
