



PINE OIL DISINFECTANT

A highly refined oil of pine concentrate which readily mixes with water to form a snow-white emulsion which will not stain when used as directed. Its powerful solvent and penetrating action enables it to clean as well as disinfect. It does not injure wood, tiles, porcelain or metals. Used in the proper dilution it reduces risk of infection from disease bacteria on inanimate surfaces. For general disinfection of homes, sickrooms, institutions, schools, hotels, industrial and public buildings, use one part to 100 parts of water.

SANITATION

The regular and thorough cleaning and proper disinfection of all quarters in which animals or poultry are kept is one of the best precautions that can be taken to aid in preventing the spread of contagious and infectious diseases.

For Stables, Kennels, Chicken Houses and Fur-Farm Buildings and Equipment—Add 3 to 4 ounces to a gallon of water and scrub or spray.

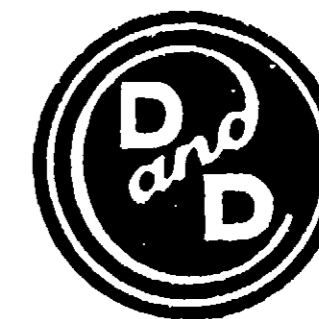

PINE OIL DISINFECTANT

For Cleaning and Scrubbing Floors, Woodwork, Marble, Tile, Painted Surfaces and Linoleum—Add one-half cup of concentrate to 12 quarts of warm water to which has been added three-fourths of the usual amount of soap. This makes cleaning easier, and assists in disinfecting and neutralizes offensive odors. This same dilution should be used for cleaning latrines, toilets, garbage cans, sinks and drains.

To Remove Odors of Cooking, or other objectionable odors, such as those found in damp cellars, closets, attics, etc., Pine Oil Disinfectant solutions, 3 to 4 table-spoonfuls to a gallon of water, may also be used as a spray throughout the house and will leave a clean, refreshing odor suggesting the fragrance of the pine forest. Use it where there is decayed vegetable or animal matter, such as in garbage receptacles, bed pans and outbuildings. As a deodorant in toilets, add a few drops full strength to the water in the bowl.

Laundry—To the average size tub or washing machine (holding about 15 gallons of water) the use of one-half cup (4 ounces) of Pine Oil Disinfectant increases efficiency of soap and produces much cleaner, whiter laundry. Makes white clothes whiter, and colored clothes brighter.
