Dear Ms. Mapp:

The Agency in accordance with the Federal Fungicide and Rodenticide Act as Amended (FIFRA) has completed reviewing all of the information submitted with your application to support the reregistration of the aforementioned product in connection the MGK 326 RED, and have concluded that your submission is acceptable.

The Agency is in the process of developing and improving the current Efficacy Assessment Guidelines for repellent products. The Agency intends to defer the determination of any related efficacy data requirements supporting the claims that may appear on this label until these Efficacy Assessment Guidelines are complete. When the guidelines are finalized, the Agency expects to issue a Data Call-In to address the revised guidelines to all registrants with registrations for personal repellent products that have not previously submitted efficacy data sufficiently consistent with the revised guidelines.

NOTE: This product is not being re-registered under FIFRA Sec. 4(g) at this time.

Virbac Animal Health, Inc. should note that a notice of availability of EPA's reregistration eligibility decision (RED) documents for products containing:

- Pyrethrins was published in the Federal Register on July 26, 2006 (Volume 71, Number 143, Pages 42387-42389).
- Piperonyl butoxide was published in the Federal Register on July 26, 2006 (Volume 71, Number 143, Pages 42385-42386).
- MGK 264 was published in the Federal Register July 26, 2006 (Volume 71, Number 143) Page 42381-42383).

As a result of these REDs, additional data and/or labeling changes may be required for products containing pyrethrins and/or piperonyl butoxide, and MGK 264.



FIRST AID

IF IN EYES: Hold eye open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15-20 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eye. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

IF SWALLOWED: Call a poison control center or doctor immediately for treatment advice. Have person sip glass of water if able to swallow. Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by a poison control center or doctor. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS CAUTION

HAZARDS TO HUMANS: Causes substantial but temporary eye injury. Do not get in eyes or on clothing. Avoid contact with skin. Wear protective eyewear (face shield or goggles), long-sleeved shirt, long pants, shoes, socks, and chemical-resistant gloves made of any waterproof material. Remove contaminated clothing and wash before reuse. Avoid contamination of food/feed.

User should wash hands before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco, or using the toilet. User should remove clothing/PPE immediately if pesticides get inside. Then wash thoroughly and put on clean clothing. User should remove PPE immediately after handling this product. Wash the outside of gloves before removing. Do not apply to pets less than 12 weeks of age. Do not reapply more often than once every 7 days.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This pesticide is toxic to fish. Do not apply directly to water, or to areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment washwaters or rinsate.

PHYSICAL OR CHEMICAL HAZARDS

Combustible. Do not use or store the product near heat or open flame.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

Do not use on horses or foals intended for slaughter. Do not apply over cuts, wounds, or irritated skin. Do not apply near eyes and mouth. Apply sparingly around ears.

SHAKE WELL BEFORE USING:

DILUTION: To kill fleas ticks and lice, thoroughly mix 1/2 oz (1 tablespoon) of dip with 1 gallon of warm water. For use under more severe reinfestation pressure, dilute at the rate of 1 fl. oz. (2 tablespoons) per gallon. Do not dilute more dip than will be used in a 24 hour period.

APPLICATION: Dip should be applied to dry or damp (not wet) coat. Sponge, dip or spray animal with the diluted concentrate making sure all areas are soaked to the skin. Let animal drip dry. Do not submerge the animals nose, mouth or eyes. DO NOT RINSE OFF! Do not reapply product for 7 days. Do not use on puppies or kittens under 12 weeks of age.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

Storage: Do not use or store near heat or open flame. Store in a cool, dry place (preferably locked) inaccessible to children and pets. Protect from freezing.

Pesticide/Container Disposal: If empty: Nonrefillable container. Do not reuse or refill this container. Offer for recycling, if available. If partially filled: Call your local solid waste agency or 1-800-CLEANUP for disposal instructions. Never place unused product down any indoor or outdoor drain.
