Revise your "Environmental Hazard" statement as follows:



STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

IF SWALLOWED: Call a physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Induce vomiting by drinking 1 or 2 glasses of water and touching the back of throat with finger. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

IF ON SKIN: Wash thoroughly with soap and water.

IF IN EYES: Flush with water.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN: If swallowed by humans, domestic animals or pets, this material may reduce the clotting ability of the blood and cause bleeding. If ingested, administer Vitamin K-1 intramuscularly or orally, as indicated in bishydroxycoumarin overdose. Repeat as necessary based on monitoring of prothrombin times.
