

STATEMENTS OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

Get medical attention in all cases of suspected poisoning.

IF SWALLOWED: Call a physician or Poison Control Center immediately. Induce vomiting by giving two glasses of water and touching back of throat with finger. Do not induce vomiting or give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

IF IN EYES: Flush immediately with plenty of water.

IF ON SKIN: Wash thoroughly with soap and water.

IF INHALED: Remove from exposure. Clear airway and assist respiration if needed.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN: If ingested, administer Vitamin K_1 intramuscularly or orally, as indicated in bishydroxycoumarin overdoses. Repeat as necessary based on monitoring of prothrombin times. In severe cases, administer Vitamin K_1 intravenously and administer blood transfusions.

OVEREXPOSURE SYMPTOMS: Symptoms may include back pain, weakness (anemia), pronenecs to bruising, nose bleed, bleeding gums and bloody vomit or urine. If serious overexposure or ingestion is known to have occurred, do not delay medical attention.

PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS DANGER

Fatal if swallowed or inhaled. If swallowed by humans, domestic animals, wildlife or pets, this material may reduce the clotting ability of the blood and cause bleeding. Do not get in eyes, on skin or on clothing. Do not breathe dust. When mixing concentrates or baits, use a dust/mist filtering respirator (MSHA/NIOSH approval number prefix TC-21C), or a NIOSH approved respirator with any R. P, or HE filter. Use chemical resistant gloves when mixing concentrates and/or baits containing warfarin. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling and before eating, smoking or using toilet. Protective goggles (or equivalent) and facility for eye-wash recommended. Wear body-covering clothing changed daily, or more often if contaminated. Launder clothing before reuse. Consult physician about baseline and periodic complete blood count and prothrombin time tests.

Exposure during pregnancy should be avoided. Warfarin may cause harm to the fetus, including possible birth defects.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This product is toxic to fish and wildlife. Keep out of lakes, streams or ponds. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes.

PRODUCT DESCRIPTION

Each particle of the warfarin in this product has been specially coated with a material that reduces detection of the warfarin by the rodents at the time the bait is consumed. The coating may help assure greater acceptance of the bait in cases where rodent awareness of uncoated warfarin is responsible for low bait acceptability.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling. Only for formulation into a Rodenticide, for (1) the following uses: control of Norway rats, roof rats, and house mice in and around homes, agricultural and industrial building, and similar man-made structures, and in sewers; (2) uses for which USEPA has accepted the required data and/or citations of data that the formulator has submitted in support of registration; and (3) uses for experimental purposes that are in compliance with USEPA requirements.

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.

Storage: Keep product in tightly closed original container. Store in a dry area not accessible to children, pets, domestic animals or wildlife. Do not store near material with a strong odor.

Pesticide Disposal: Pesticide wastes are acutely hazardous. Improper disposal of excess pesticide or rinsate is a violation of Federal Law.
