

USE RESTRICTIONS. For control of Norway rats, Roof rats and House mice in and around homes, industrial and agricultural buildings, and similar man-made structures.

Treated baits must be placed in tamper-proof bait boxes or in locations not accessible to children, pets, domestic animals or wildlife. Do not place bait in areas where there is a possibility of contaminating food or surfaces that come in direct contact with food.

SELECTION OF TREATMENT AREAS. After removing as much food, water, and harborage as possible, determine areas where rats or mice will most likely find and consume the bait. Generally, these areas are along walls, by grained openings, in or beside burrows in corners and concealed places, between floors and walls, or in location where rodents or their signs have been observed. Protect bait from rain or snow.

APPLICATION DIRECTIONS

RATS: Apply 4 to 16 ounces of bait per placement. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for at least 10 days.
MICE: Apply 1/4 to 1/2 ounce (1-2 level tablespoons) of bait at 8 to 12 foot intervals. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for at least 15 days.
RATS & MICE: Replace contaminated or spoiled bait immediately. Collect and dispose of all dead animals and unconsumed bait properly. Repeat treatment when infestation recurs. Where continuous source of infestation is present, establish permanent bait stations and replenish bait as needed.

The rodenticide contains Warfarin, an anticoagulant chemical that reduces the clotting ability of the blood and, in repeated feedings, causes fatal hemorrhage in rats and mice. It also produces Vitamin K₁, an antidote.
