Dead-Lite Roach Spray is a residual action insecticide effective in the control of roaches and waterbugs. This non-staining spray leaves the kitchen or premises clean and, unlike powders, does not leave any messiness behind.

DIRECTIONS

Apply only as spot treatments in the home or premises limiting the treatment to use surfaces where the pests have been seen or where they are suspected of hiding. Such treatments would normally be limited to a maximum of 20% of the floor and lower wall surfaces including shelving and cabinets.

Using a coarse, wet spray, spray Dead-Lite Roach Spray with force around refrigerators, sinks, cabinets, pantry shelves, into all cracks in moulding and woodwork, pipe openings in walls and floors. In the absence of a sprayer, use a paint brush, to treat surfaces and other areas where the insects rest, run or hide. Repeat treatment as often as necessary.

CAUTION: KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN. Harmful if swallowed. Repeated or prolonged contact with skin can cause toxic symptoms. In case of contact with skin, wash with soap and water. Avoid breathing spray mist. Do not spray into or near an open flame. Do not smoke while spraying. Avoid contamination of food. Do not use on household pets. Dead-Lite contains petroleum naphtha and should be used with care on certain types of composition flooring such as rubber, asphalt tile, etc.
