With regards to labeling, you must make the labeling changes listed below:

- 1) Per PR Notice 96-6, please place your company or Animal Poison Control Center telephone number on your label. This number should be a resource for consumers in the event of an emergency or to receive information concerning the proper use of your product.
- 2) Based on your Tox categories, your product is required to have a "Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals" statement. It should be located under the general heading of "Precautionary Statements" and read as follows:

CAUTION

Harmful if swallowed or absorbed through the skin. Causes moderate eye irritation. Avoid contact with eyes, skin or clothing. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling.

3) Your product is required to have a "Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals" statement. It should be located under the general heading of "Precautionary Statements" and read as follows:

CAUTION

Harmful if swallowed or absorbed through the skin. Causes moderate eye irritation. Avoid contact with eyes, skin or clothing. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling.

4) Your product is required to have a "First Aid"statement, which should be located near your "Precautionary Statements". It should state the following:

IF SWALLOWED: Call a physician or Poison Control Center. Drink 1 or 2 glasses of water and induce vomiting or if available by administering syrup of ipecac. If person is unconscious, do not give anything by mouth and do not induce vomiting.

IF ON SKIN: Wash with plenty of soap and water. Get medical attention if irritation persists.

IF IN EYES: Flush eyes with plenty of water. Call a physician if irritation persists.

- 5) Your product is also required to have a "Note to Physicians and Veterinarians". This should be located directly below your Statement of Practical Treatment and should contain the following information:
 - Technical information on symptomatology;
 - Use of supportive treatments to maintain life functions;
 - Medicine that will counteract the specific physiological effects of the pesticide;
 - Company telephone number to specific medical personnel who can provide specialized medical advice.
 - Information for veterinarians.
- 6) Please revise the first sentence of the first full paragraph under DIRECTIONS FOR USE to read as follows: "Do not use on kittens under 12 weeks of age". Per our November 23, 1998 letter from

John Leahy to Ms. Pat Bieler, the data you cited was for use of collars on dogs younger than 12 weeks. Those data can not be used for products that are applied to cats. Thus your statement must be consistent with PR Notice 96-6.

- 7) Please revise the statement concerning debilitated, aged, or medicated animals to read ""Consult a veterinarian before using this product on debilitated, aged, medicated pregnant or nursing animals."
- Please add the following statement: "Do not use this product on animals simultaneously or within 30 days before or after treatment with or exposure to cholinesterase inhibiting drugs, pesticides or chemicals. Flea and tick collars may be immediately replaced with new collars". The technical review of the data you cited does not support the omission of this statement from the product label.
- 9) The product name we have on file for your product is "Hartz 2 in 1 Collar for Cats. This differs from your labeled product name of "Longlife 90 Day Collar for Cats". Please verify the correct product name for our records.
- 10) We have enclosed a copy of your label stamped "Accepted with comments". Please submit two (2) copies of your final printed label before you release the product for shipment. Please refer to the A-79 enclosure for a further description of final printed labeling.

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

REMOVE COLLAR FROM PACKAGE, UNROLL AND STRETCH TO ACTIVATE INSECTICIDE GENERATOR

It is not advisable to use this collar or similar pesticides on kittens less than 6 weeks of age. Do not unroll collar until ready to use. Place the Longlife 90 Day Brand TM collar around cat's neck, adjust for proper fit, and buckle in place. The collar must be worn loosely to allow for growth of the cat and to permit the collar to move to move about the neck. Generally, a properly fitted collar is one that when fastened will snugly slide over the cat's head. Leave 2 or 3 inches on the collar for extra adjustment and cut off and dispose of the extra length. Consult a veterinarian before using this product on debilitated, aged or medicated animals. Sensitivity may occur after using ANY pesticide product for pets. Some animals may become irritated by any collar if it is applied too tightly. If this occurs loosen the collar. If irritation continues, remove the collar from the animal. If signs of sensitivity occur remove the collar and bathe your pet with mild soap and rinse with large amounts of water. If signs continue, consult a veterinarian immediately. The collar is intended for use only as an insecticide generator. For continuous flea protection under normal conditions, replace the collar every 3 months. Under conditions where cats are exposed to severe flea infestation it may be necessary to replace the collar every 2 months. Ticks may be an occasional problem for cats. The collar will kill ticks, including the Deer Tick, which may carry Lyme Disease, for 60 days and continue to aid in their control an additional 30 days. The cat should be examined from time to time and the collar replaced when mature tick or flea populations begin to appear. Wetting will not impair the collar's effectiveness or pet's protection. If the cat is out in the rain it is not necessary to remove the collar. The Longlife 90 Day Brand collar may be worn with a regular collar.

DISPOSAL - Do not use empty pouch. Dispose in trash collection.
