REMOVE COLLAR FROM PACKAGE, UNROLL AND STRETCH TO ACTIVATE INSECTICIDE GENERATOR

Do not unroll collar until ready to use. Place the Hartz "2 in 174" collar around the dog's neck, adjust for proper fit, and brokle in place. The collar must be worn towardy to allow for growth of the dog and to permit the collar to move about the neck. Generally, a properly fitted collar is one that when fastened will anughy alide uver the dog's head, Leave 2 or 3 inches on the collar for extra adjustment and out off and dispose of the extra length. Some animals may become irritated by any collar if it is applied too tightly. If this occurs loosen the collar, if irritation continues remove the collar from the animal. This collar is intended for use only as an insecticide generator.

Kills fleas and ticks common to dogs, including Rocky Mountain Wood Tick; carrier of Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever. The collar will begin to kill fleas and ticks and mediately. Its full protection against harder to kill ticks will be built up withing few days after being placed on the pet. For continuous flea and tick protection under normal conditions replace the collar every five months. Under conditions where dogs are exposed to severe flea or tick infestations it may be necessary to replace the collar more frequently. Wetting will not impair the collar's effectiveness or the pet's protection. If the dog goes swimming or is out in the rain it is not necessary to remove the collar. The Hartz "2 in 1_{TM}" collar may be worn with a regular collar.


