On the basis of information furnished by the registrant, the above named pesticide is hereby Registered/Reregistered under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act.

A copy of the labeling accepted in connection with this Registration/Reregistration is returned herewith.

Registration is in no way to be construed as an indorsement or approval of this product by this Agency. In order to protect health and the environment, the Administrator, on his motion, may at any time suspend or cancel the registration of a pesticide in accordance with the Act. The acceptance of any name in connection with the registration of a product under this Act is not to be construed as giving the registrant a right to exclusive use of the name or to its use if it has been covered by others.

This product is conditionally registered in accordance with FIFRA sec. 3(c)(7)(A) since you have agreed to:

1. Submit and/or cite all data or other material for registration/ reregistration of your product under FIFRA section 3(c)(5) or FIFRA section 4 when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data.
2. Make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment:
 - a. Add the phrase, "EPA Registration No. 2596-120."
 - b. Revise the chemical name for esfenvalerate by inserting a "4" between (s) and CHLORO.

As required in PR-Notice 91-2, the label claim for active ingredients must be based on the nominal concentration rather than the lower certified limit. The nominal concentration should fall between the upper and lower certified limits. Moreover, the lower certified limit may not fall below the efficacy level. Based on the Confidential Statements of Formula (CSF) dated 9/18/90, the nominal concentration of esfenvalerate is 0.034% x 75% or 0.0255%. The nominal concentration of DEET and other isomers is 4.2% x 95.5% or 4.01%. The label or the CSF should be revised so that the label claim agrees with the nominal concentration of the two ingredients.

c. Under Directions for Use change "Do not spray in eyes." to "Do not spray in eyes or on genitalia."

Similarly, under Precautionary Statements, change "Avoid spraying in eyes." to "Do not spray in eyes or on genitalia."

d. Since this product is in toxicity category III in terms of its dermal LD₅₀ and primary eye irritation potentials, revise the Precautionary Statements and Statement of Practical Treatment as follows:

**Precautionary Statements
Hazards to Humans and Domestic Animals**

Avoid spraying in eyes. Avoid prolonged contact with skin. Wear protective gloves or mitts when applying spray and do not pet animal until spray has dried. Apply spray in a well ventilated area. Avoid inhalation of spray. Do not use on pregnant or young (less than one year old) cats. Do not use this or any other pesticide on sick, old or debilitated pets... (etc.)

Statement of Practical Treatment

IF IN EYES: Immediately flush with plenty of water. Get medical attention if irritation persists.

IF ON SKIN: Wash with soap and water. Get medical attention if irritation develops or persists.

f. Include the statement "Do not contaminate water, food, or feed." under Storage and Disposal statement also.

g. Include the company street address or P.O. Box number with the name and address.

3. The pH of the concentrate of the pressurized product is 3.5 to 4.0. The CSF should be revised to reflect this.

4. Submit five copies of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment. Refer to the A-79 Enclosure for a further description of final printed labeling.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA sec. 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions. A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.

To repel fleas and ticks, hold container 6 to 10 inches from animal and spray over entire body, including feet and tail. Do not spray in eyes. Apply lightly. Do not saturate animal's coat. Spray approximately two seconds for each pound of pet's body weight. For best results, direct spray against the natural lay of the fur to cause fluffing of the coat. Do not apply more often than every seven days. In periods of

heavy infestation or ticks may be for added protection. bedding, quarters area should also be treated until damp to help kill them. For continued protection use of Hartz 2 in 1 Cat Flea and Tick Repellent is recommended. Do not use on garden insecticide product.

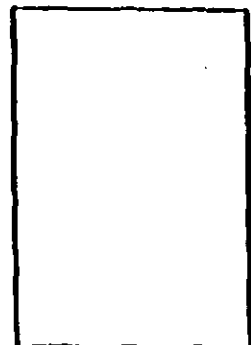
STORAGE AND CONTAINER: Store in original container and puncture or incise.
