EXPORTANT: Do not expose children, pets, or other nontarget animals to redenticides. To help to prevent accidents:

1. Store product not in use in a location out of reach of children and pets.

- 2. Apply bait in locations out of reach of children, pets, domestic animals and nontarget wildlife, or in tamperresistant bait stations. These stations must be resistant to destruction by dogs and by children under six years of age, and must be used in a manner that prevents such children from reaching into bait compartments and obtaining bait. If bait can be shaken from stations when they are lifted, units must be secured or otherwise immobilized. Even stronger bait stations are needed in areas open to hoofed livestock, raccoons, bears, or other potentially destructive animals, or in areas prone to vandalism.

USE RESTRICTIONS: For control of Norway rats, Roof rats, and House mice in and around homes, industrial and agricultural building, and similar manimade structures. Do not place balt in areas where there is a possibility of contaminating food or surfaces that come in direct contact with food. Do not "roadcast bait.

Selection of Treatment Areas: Determine areas where rats and/or mice will most likely find and consume the bait. Generally, these areas are along walls, by gnawed openings, in burrows, in corners and concealed places, between floors and walls, or in locations where rodents or their signs have been observed. Protect bait from rain or snow. Remove as much alternative food as possible.

Application Directi vise: Rats: Apply one to five place packs per placement. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for at least 10 days.

Mice: Open pack and apply 1/4 to 1/2 ounce (1-2 level tablespoons) of balt at 8-12 foo. intervals. Larger placements (up to 2 ounces) may be needed at points of high mouse activity. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for a least 15 days.

Rate and Mice: Replace contaminated or spoiled bait immediately. Collect and dispose of all dead animals and unconsumed bait properly. To prevent reinfestation, eliminate food, water, and harborage as much as possible. If reinfestation does occur, repeat treatment. Where a continuous source of infestation is present, establish permanent bait stations and replenish bait as needed.

STORAGE & DISPOSAL: Storage: Store only in original container, in a dry place inaccessible to children and pets. Disposal: Do not reuse empty container. Securely wrap in newspaper and discard in trash.
