DIRECTIONS FOR SPRAYING

Spraying equipment should evenly distribute the spray material over the plants. The amount of water used per acre is not particularly important. Successful results have been obtained with as little as 2 gallons per acre.

RATE OF APPLICATION

For the control of weeds in wheat, oats, barley, use 1/4 to 1/2 pts. of 2,4-D Air Ester 99% per acre. Do not spray winter wheat or barley in the fall. Spray in the spring after the wheat or barley has tillered and as near the 5-leaf stage as possible, but before it is in the boot. Do not forage or graze treated grain fields within 2 weeks after treatment with 2,4-D.

SAGEBRUSH: For the control of sagebrush in pastures, use 1 pint of Air Ester per acre: Do not spray near susceptible crops as they may be damaged by drifting fumes. Spray sagebrush during early growing stage in early summer. Minimum gallons per acre for aerial application is 2-5 gallons per acre.

Do not graze treated areas by dairy animals within 7 days after treatment.

Do not apply to newly seeded pastures.
