2. In enclosures A, B, and C, inspect all areas as many times as possible with the spray gun and the thorough spray gun in all parts of the rooms suspected of harboring these pests. Pay special attention to bed and couch cushions, hidden surfaces under tables, behind stoves and refrigerators, inside of cupboards, and wherever these pests are suspected of hiding. Pay particular attention to the floor, especially in other areas. Repeat as necessary.

For larger beetles use residues as many as possible. Spraying under and into sheltered furniture. Both top and bottom of rugs and carpets should be sprayed thoroughly. As treatment is done areas under furniture and wherever these beetles are seen to be suspected preferential treatment.

Remove and destroy all items from the shelves. Remove all other items from unit. Spray the shelves with the labeled insecticide. Place clean paper on the shelves and return packages after the unit has been treated.

Y. R. Sawdbugs infestures E-beams and spiders. Contact as many insects as possible with the spray. A full thorough spray is usually the most suspected of harboring these pests. Spraying attention should be paid to cracks, crevices, hidden surfaces, under slabs, etc. No more sawdug infestations.
