HOW TO USE REAL PINE OIL DISINFECTANT

Thoroughly wet all surfaces to be cleaned, deodorized, and disinfected using dilutions as indicated below.

GENERAL HOUSEHOLD USES: Use 3 tablespoonfuls to a gallon of water for Cleaning, Disinfecting, Washing, Deodorizing and Scrubbing Ceramic Tile, Woodwork, Floors, Cabinets, Basement, Kitchen, Bathroom. Not recommended for asphalt or rubber tile floors.

FOR CLEANING: Use 4 tablespoonfuls to a gallon of water for cleaning Sickroom Utensils, Bathroom Fixtures.

FOR DEODORIZING: Use 3 tablespoonfuls to a quart of water for Garbage Pails, Refuse Containers.

CAUTION: HARMFUL IF SWALLOWED. MAY CAUSE SKIN AND EYE IRRITATION. DO NOT BREATHE SPRAY MIST. AVOID CONTACT WITH SKIN, EYES, OR CLOTHING.

FIRST AID: IF SWALLOWED, DO NOT INDUCE VOMITING. GIVE RAW EGG WHITE, MILK MUCILAGE OR CORNSTARCH PASTE. CALL A PHYSICIAN IMMEDIATELY.

RINSE EMPTY CONTAINER THOROUGHLY WITH WATER AND DISCARD IT. DO NOT RE-USE.
