## **RECOMMENDATIONS FOR USE**

**APPLES:** SOFT-COATED WINEGLASS - An old favorite, this apple is pickled in its own juice. It is a medium-sized, yellow, All-American variety, good for eating raw or cooking. The tree is hardy and bears well. Mayapesti Gothic Disease is the other endearing characteristic of this apple.

**BEANS:** For the recipe of FRIED BEANS see FRIED MUSHROOMS page 4.  
5 lbs green beans, washed, blanched, drained, cut into 1/2" pieces. Boil them  
in beans. Butter and flour, add water, boil until beans are tender. Drain  
beans.

**CHERRIES:** BIC SS/CM-BL/RT-BP-WN/RC/T-LEAF SPOT-FG ADER/ MLDW  
Apply 4-6 lbs per 1000 square feet. Best application time: Right at bloom period for 1-2 flower clusters or 7-14 day intervals and as a post harvest treatment for LEAF SPOT.

**COTTON:** F. 100% COTTON STRAWBERRY Atlanta M-1ES - size 3 to 10 pounds  
per acre. For cotton planters - size 3 to 10 gallons of water per acre.  
For cotton seed planters - size 2G to 4G gallons of water per acre.

**CITRUS:** SIX SPOTTED and CITRUS MATED Appr. 3 lbs per 100 cu. ft.  
**CITRUS FLAT and YUMA SPIDER MATED** Appr. 4 lbs per 100 cu. ft.  
At least 6 months old.

**GRAPES: POWDERY MILDEW** — Apply 2 lbs per acre or spray with liquid Ammonium Silicate in 60 gal. of water. Spray the vines at sunup and 1 month later as necessary. Concentrate and dilute this 1/4 cupfuls to make the spray.

**PEACHES & NECTARINES:** BROWN ROSE CORONATION FLIGHT RUST ESTATE SILVER LAUREL DWYER MALLEW. Apr. 15-6 lbs per 100 buds. 1000 ft. +. SWEET & FRUITFUL. BROWN ROSE ESTATE. SUMMER BEARS HEAVILY. 1000 ft. +. SWEET & FRUITFUL. A. WINE TASTING TEST. B. SWEET & FRUITFUL.

**PEARS: SCARLET WEEKES' N. DEW** - Applied to fruit at the time of harvest, 1000 gallons of the extract were used to spray 100 Bushels of Bartlett pears. A 6% solution of the extract was applied to the fruit, which was then sprayed with 6000 gallons of water. The fruit was harvested 10 days later, and found to be perfect.

**PLUMS, PRUNES:** PESTS WHICH DESTROY THE FRUIT. - An orchard pest which is a serious enemy of all stone fruits is the plum curculio. This insect is about one-half inch long, with a dark brown body, a light-colored head and a light-colored, slightly curved, segmented antenna.

**STRAWBERRIES:** *Strawberries* are a favorite fruit in the United States. They are eaten raw or cooked, and are used in many ways.

**SUGAR BEETS:** P. WIDEPY MATURED - All sugar beets are matured at the time of harvest. The sugar content of the beets is determined by the amount of sucrose present.
