The labeling cited above and submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is accepted subject to the comments listed on the enclosed sheet. A copy of your proposed labeling stamped "ACCEPTED WITH COMMENTS" is enclosed.

SERIOUS ERROR(S) ON SUBMITTED LABELING:

EPA has determined that one or more of the errors on the labeling you submitted to the Agency is categorized as "serious" as defined in PR Notice 93-11. The following specific comments pertain to your WPS labeling submission concerning the product cited above:

Add the following User Safety Recommendation to the label in the location shown in Section A on Part I of the Product Worksheet in Supplement Three-A to PR Notice 93-7: "Wash hands before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco, or using the toilet.

The glove requirement for "applicators and other handlers" in the "Personal Protective Equipment" section on your proposed labeling is missing or does not match the chemical-resistance category identified on your proposed labeling. Correct the chemical-resistance category statement (if necessary) to state: "Some materials that are chemical resistant to this product are listed below. If you want more options, follow the instructions for category G on EPA chemical resistance category selection chart. Remove the incorrect glove requirement (if any) and add "Chemical-resistant gloves, such as barrier laminate or viton." The exact location is shown in Sections A and B on Part 1 of the Product Worksheet in Supplement Three-A to PR Notice 93-7.

You have incorrect wording in the first paragraph in the Agricultural Use Requirements box on your proposed label. That paragraph must contain the exact wording of the paragraph shown as "2" in Section F on Part 2 of the Product Worksheet in Supplement Three-A to PR Notice 93-7.

You have incorrect wording in the second-to-last sentence in the first pararaph in the Agricultural Use Requirements box on your proposed label. The sentence must be as follows: "It also contains specific instructions and exceptions pertaining to the statements on this label about personal protective equipment (PPE), notification to workers and

BEANS (Root and Stem Rot — Rhizoctonia solari): FURROW — Application rates are to 14,500 linear feet of row for bush type beans and to 8,430 linear feet of row for pole beans. Apply 2-3 qts. In 8 to 19 gallone of water. Spray planting furrow and covering soli at planting time. Avoid applying directly to seed; otherwise delayed emergence may occur. IN CALIFORNIA AND ARIZONA apply 3-4 pints in 8 to 10 gale, of water. Apply in furrow and incorporate with covering soil at planting. Use lower rate for lighter solis. Avoid application to bare seed.

SNAP AND DRY BEANS (White Mold — Sclerotinia sclerotionum): Use 1 gal. mixed in 8 to 10 gals, of water and apply to 14,500 linear feet of row for bush type beans or to 8,430 linear feet of row for pole beans. Spray in an 8° wide band, centered on the row, immediately after or at time of seeding. Avoid applying directly to seed: otherwise de-ayed emergence may occur. (Where dinitro type pre-emergence herbicides are used add 1 gal: to the final herbicide spray mix and apply simultaneously.) it disease is severe, application may be repeated at 21o3 week intervals, using 1 to 2 nozzles per row and directing spray at base of plants. Do not apply after first bloom. Soil should remain undisturbed after treatment. Do not feed treated vines to live stock.

COTTON (Demping Off — Rhizoctonia soleni): Use ½ to 1 gallon per acre in at least 15 gallons of water (per 13,000 linear leet of row based on 40° spacings). Spray on the seed and surrounding soil at time of planting. Do not allow the feeding or grazing of cotton tokage by livestock.

GARLIC (White Rot — Sciencium coptivorium): Use 10 gallons mixed in 100 gallons of water and to 21.8/20 linear test of row at planting time. Attach a suitable rig to the machine planter using 2 nozzles per planting turrow. Direct the ition rozzle to spray the bottom of the open turrow and the "seed" as it is dropped. Detect the rear nozzle to spray the covering soil.


