# PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

#### STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

Remove victim immediately to emergency treatment facilities

If on skin: Remove by washing with soap and water. Get medical attention If in eyes: Flush the eyes with clean water for 10 minutes. Get medical attention.

If inhaled: Remove viction to fresh air. Transport immediately to emergency treatment facility.

ANTIDOTE: Note to Physician. Carbaryl is a moderate, reversible, cholinesterase inhibitor. Atropine is antidotal.

#### DIRECTIONS FOR USE (Continued):

- APRICOTS, PEACHES, PLUMS and NECTARINES: Use 40 to 50 lbs. per acre by air or ground to control TWIG BORER and ORIENTAL FRUIT MOTH. Do not use within 3 days of harvest on Apricots and Nectarines or within I day on Peaches and Plums.
- BEANS: Use 20 lbs. per acre to control MEXICAN BEAN BEETLES, LEAF-HOPPERS, BEAN LEAF BEETLES, CUCUMBER BEETLES, WESTERN BEAN CUTWORMS, FLEA BEETLES, CORN EARWORMS, ARMYWORMS, VELVET BEAN CATERPILLARS, LYGUS and STINK BUGS. Do not feed treated vines to meat or dairy animals.
- CORN: Use 20 lbs. per acre to control CORN EARWORM, FALL ARMYWORM, SAP BEETLES and JAPANESE BEETLES. Do not apply within 7 days of harvest for forage. For Corn Earworms apply to silks as soon as they appear. Make 3 to 4 applications of 2-3 day Intervals, Reapply Immediately after rain.
- COTTON: Use 20 to 25 lbs. per acre to control THRIPS, FLEA BEETLES, FLEA-HOPPERS, LEAFWORMS, BOLLWORMS, FALL ARMYWORMS, LEAF PER-FORATORS, LEAF ROLLERS, LEAFHOPPERS, LYGUS BUGS, SALT MARSH CATERPILLARS, STINK BUGS and GRASSHOPPERS. Do not graze treated fields or feed cotton trash to dairy or meat animals.
- EGGPLANTS, PEPPERS and TOMATOES: Use 20 lbs. per acre to control TOMATO FRUITWORMS, FALL ARMYWORMS, FLEA BEETLES, LEAFHOP-PERS, TOMATO HORNWORMS, EUROPEAN CORN BORRER, STINK BUGS. COLORADO POTATO BEETLES and LYGUS BUGS. No time limitation.
- FILBERTS (Not for use in California). Use 40 to 50 pounds per acre to control FILBERT APHID, FILBERT LEAFROLLER, and FILBERT MOTH.
- GRAPES: Use 20 to 25 lbs. per acre to control GRAPE LEAF FOLDERS, GRAPE LEAFHOPPERS, GRAPE BERRY MOTHS and JAPANESE BEETLES. No time
- POTATOES: Use 15 to 20 lbs. per acre to control LEAFHOPPERS, FLEA BEETLES and COLORADO POTATO BEETLES. Apply to foliage only. SPITTLEBUGS, and
- STRAWBERRIES: Use 20 lbs
