IMPORTANT NOTICE: This Letter Requires You to Submit a Notification to the Office of Compliance Monitoring within 20 Days.

Dear Registrant:

The labeling cited above and submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is accepted subject to the comments listed on the enclosed sheet. A copy of your proposed labeling stamped "ACCEPTED WITH COMMENTS" is enclosed.

SERIOUS ERROR(S) ON SUBMITTED LABELING:

EPA has determined that one or more of the errors on the labeling you submitted to the Agency is categorized as "serious" as defined in PR Notice 93-11. In general, serious errors are those that may create a potential for harm to workers, handlers, other persons, or the environment; or those that prevent the achievement of the basic goals of the Worker Protection Standard (WPS) or FIFRA.

YOU MUST NOT SELL OR DISTRIBUTE (INCLUDING RELEASE FOR SHIPMENT) ANY PRODUCT BEARING THE SUBMITTED LABELING. Sale or distribution of any product with the incorrect labeling is a violation of FIFRA that could result in initiation of an action for civil penalties and/or cancellation of your product. This matter has been referred to the Office of Compliance Monitoring (OCM) for further action.

2. EPA Registration number of the product for which the labeling was submitted.
3. Whether any product already has been sold or distributed (this includes released for shipment) bearing the submitted labeling.

In addition, the notification must include the following information, IF you have already sold or distributed any product bearing the submitted labeling:

1. Quantity of the product that has been sold or distributed.
2. EPA Producing Establishment number.
3. Location of the product, if known.
4. Proposed plan for assuring that product with the incorrect labeling in your control, as well as that in the hands of dealers/distributors/users, will be corrected. The plan must include your proposal for assuring that the labeling is corrected as soon as possible.

Failure to submit a notification also may result in initiation of an action under FIFRA for civil penalties, if you sold or distributed (this includes released for shipment) product bearing the incorrect labeling.

IN ADDITION, YOU SHOULD CONTACT IMMEDIATELY THE PERSONS TO WHOM YOU SOLD OR DISTRIBUTED YOUR PRODUCT AND INFORM THEM NOT TO SELL OR DISTRIBUTE ANY PRODUCT WITH THE INCORRECT LABELING.

WHAT THIS ACCEPTANCE MEANS:

Based on your certification, the Agency has accepted the labeling changes that are necessary to comply with the WPS labeling requirements of 40 CFR part 156, subpart K, described in PR Notices 93-7 and 93-11. Any other labeling changes submitted in connection with this amendment application but not directly related to compliance with the WPS have neither been reviewed nor accepted by the Agency. If you wish to make such changes, you must submit a separate amendment application proposing them. If your product is currently suspended, the acceptance of this labeling amendment does not affect the suspension in any way.

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO NEXT:

- **WITHIN** one year from date of this acceptance.



HAZARDS TO HUMANS

CAUTION: May be harmful if swallowed. Avoid breathing dust. Avoid contact with eyes, skin or clothing. Wash thoroughly after handling. Take shower or bath after work. Wear regular long-sleeved work clothing. Change to clean clothing daily.

Do not apply this product in such a manner as to directly or through drift expose workers or other persons. The area being treated must be vacated by unprotected persons.

ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS

This pesticide is extremely toxic to aquatic and estuarine invertebrates. For terrestrial uses, do not apply directly to water, or to areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark. Do not contaminate water by cleaning of equipment or disposal of wastes.

DO NOT ALLOW THIS PRODUCT TO DRIFT FROM THE AREA BEING TREATED.

This product is highly toxic to bees exposed to direct treatment or residues on blooming crops or weeds. Do not apply this product or allow it to drift to blooming crops or weeds if bees are visiting the treatment area.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

RE-ENTRY STATEMENTS

Do not enter treated areas without protective clothing (see above) until dust has settled. Because certain states may require more restrictive re-entry intervals for various crops treated with this product, consult your State Department of Agriculture for further information.

Written or oral warnings must be given to workers who are expected to be in a treated area or in an area about to be treated with this product. Oral warnings should specify protective clothing (see above), areas or fields that cannot be entered without this clothing, period of time area is to be vacated, and statement of practical treatment (see right) in case of exposure. When oral warnings are given, warnings shall be given in a language customarily understood by workers. 2. Pesticide Disposal: Wastes resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.
3. Container Disposal: Completely empty bag into application equipment. Then dispose of empty bag in a sanitary landfill or by incineration, or, if allowed by State and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.
4. Storage: Store in original container only and keep sealed. Store in closed storage areas. Use caution when moving, opening, closing or pouring.

ALFALFA and CLOVERS: Use 15 lbs. per acre to control THRIPS, LEAFHOPPERS, THREE-CORNERED ALFALFA HOPPER, JAPANESE BEETLES, ALFALFA CATERPILLARS, ARMYWORMS, CORN EARWORMS and STINK BUGS. Do not apply within 3 days of harvest on alfalfa.

APRICOTS, PEACHES, PLUMS and NECTARINES: Use 40 to 50 lbs. per acre by air or ground to control TWIG BORER and ORIENTAL FRUIT MOTH. Do not use within 3 days of harvest on Apricots and Nectarines or within 1 day on Peaches and Plums.

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT

If swallowed: Call a physician immediately. Give a glass or two of water through with finger. It is preferable to induce vomiting under medical supervision endotracheal tube because of aspiration hazard. Remove victim immediately.

If on skin: Remove by washing with soap and water. Get medical attention.

If in eyes: Flush the eyes with clean water for 10 minutes. Get medical attention.

If inhaled: Remove victim to fresh air. Transport immediately to emergency room.

ANTIDOTE: Note to Physician. Carbaryl is a moderate, reversible, cholinergic antagonist.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE (continued)

BEANS: Use 20 lbs. per acre to control MEXICAN BEAN BEETLES, LEAFHOPPERS, CUCUMBER BEETLES, WESTERN BEAN CUTWORMS, FLEA BEETLES, BEAN WORMS, VELVET BEAN CATERPILLARS, LYGUS and STINK BUGS. Do not use on animals.

CORN: Use 20 lbs. per acre to control CORN EARWORM, FALL ARMYWORM, BEETLES. Do not apply within 7 days of harvest for forage. For Corn Earworm, make 3 to 4 applications at 2-3 day intervals. Respray immediately after rain.

COTTON: Use 25 lbs. per acre to control THRIPS, FLEA BEETLE, FLEA BEETLE, FALL ARMYWORM, LEAF PERFORATOR, LEAF ROLLERS, LEAFHOPPERS, CATERPILLAR, STINK BUGS and GRASSHOPPERS. Do not graze trees or meat animals. Do not use within 7 days of harvest.

EGGPLANTS, PEPPERS and TOMATOES: Use 20 lbs. per acre to control BEETLES, FLEA BEETLES, LEAFHOPPERS, TOMATO HORNWORMS, BEETLES, COLORADO POTATO BEETLES and LYGUS BUGS. No time limitation.

FILBERTS (Not for use in California): Use 40 to 50 lbs. per acre to control BEETLES and FILBERT MOTH.

GRAPES: Use 20 to 25 lbs. per acre to control GRAPE LEAF FOLDER, BERRY MOTHS and JAPANESE BEETLES. No time limitation.

POTATOES: Use 15 to 20 lbs. per acre to control LEAFHOPPERS, FLEA BEETLES. Apply to foliage only.

STRAWBERRIES: Use 20 lbs. per acre to control MEADOW SPITTLEBUG. Do not use within 1 day of harvest.
