IMPORTANT NOTICE: This Letter Requires You to Submit a Notification to the Office of Compliance Monitoring within 20 Days.

Dear Registrant:

The labeling cited above and submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is accepted subject to the comments listed on the enclosed sheet. A copy of your proposed labeling stamped "ACCEPTED WITH COMMENTS" is enclosed.

SERIOUS ERROR(S) ON SUBMITTED LABELING:

EPA has determined that one or more of the errors on the labeling you submitted to the Agency is categorized as "serious" as defined in PR Notice 93-11. In general, serious errors are those that may create a potential for harm to workers, handlers, other persons, or the environment; or those that prevent the achievement of the basic goals of the Worker Protection Standard (WPS) or FIFRA.

YOU MUST NOT SELL OR DISTRIBUTE (INCLUDING RELEASE FOR SHIPMENT) ANY PRODUCT BEARING THE SUBMITTED LABELING. Sale or distribution of any product with the incorrect labeling is a violation of FIFRA that could result in initiation of an action for civil penalties and/or cancellation of your product. This matter has been referred to the Office of Compliance Monitoring (OCM) for further action.

1. Quantity of the product that has been sold or distributed.
2. EPA Producing Establishment number.
3. Location of the product, if known.
4. Proposed plan for assuring that product with the incorrect labeling in your control, as well as that in the hands of dealers/distributors/users, will be corrected. The plan must include your proposal for assuring that the labeling is corrected as soon as possible.

Failure to submit a notification also may result in initiation of an action under FIFRA for civil penalties, if you sold or distributed (this includes released for shipment) product bearing the incorrect labeling.

IN ADDITION, YOU SHOULD CONTACT IMMEDIATELY THE PERSONS TO WHOM YOU SOLD OR DISTRIBUTED YOUR PRODUCT AND INFORM THEM NOT TO SELL OR DISTRIBUTE ANY PRODUCT WITH THE INCORRECT LABELING.

WHAT THIS ACCEPTANCE MEANS:

Based on your certification, the Agency has accepted the labeling changes that are necessary to comply with the WPS labeling requirements of 40 CFR part 156, subpart K, described in PR Notices 93-7 and 93-11. - **WITHIN** one year from date of this acceptance.



DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling.

RE-ENTRY STATEMENT

Do not enter treated areas without protective clothing until dusts have settled. Because certain states may require re-entry intervals for various crops treated with this product, consult your State Department of Agriculture for further information.

Written or oral warnings must be given to workers who are expected to be in a treated area or in an area about to be treated with this product. Oral warnings should specify protective clothing, areas or fields that cannot be entered without this clothing, period of time area is to be vacated, and statement of practical treatment in case of exposure. When oral warnings are given, warnings shall be given in a language customarily understood by workers. Oral warnings must be given if there is reason to believe that written warnings cannot be understood by workers. Warnings must include the following information: "Caution. Area treated with Diazinon on (date of application). Do not enter without appropriate protective clothing until dusts have settled. (insert here action to take in case of accidental exposure.)"

STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

1. **Prohibitions:** Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.
2. **Pesticide Disposal:** Wastes resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.
3. **Container Disposal:** Completely empty bag into application equipment. Then dispose of empty bag in a sanitary landfill or by incineration, or, if allowed by State and local authorities, by burning. If burned, stay out of smoke.
4. **Storage:** Store in original container only and keep sealed. Store in closed storage areas. Use caution when moving, opening, closing, or pouring.

SUGGESTIONS FOR USE

Apply when insects are present on plants and when air is quiet, preferably in early morning. Excessive dust drift is wasteful. Do not mix or dilute this dust with other materials. Even coverage of infested parts of plants is essential for control. Dosage per acre will depend on size of plants, type of duster, degree or severity of infestation. Use only sufficient material to effect desirable control. This product is formulated to be applied by ground or air application.

DO NOT USE THIS PRODUCT FOR ANY PURPOSE OTHER THAN THAT RECOMMENDED ON THIS LABEL.

DO NOT ALLOW THIS PRODUCT TO DRIFT FROM AREA BEING TREATED.

BEANS (Snap): Use 30 to 50 lbs. per acre to control BLACK BEAN APHIDS, MEXICAN BEAN BEETLES, LEAF HOPPERS, DIPTEROUS LEAF MINERS and SPIDER MITES. Do not apply within 7 days of harvest.

BEETS, CELERY, LETTUCE and SPINACH: Use 25 lbs. per acre to control APHIDS, FLEA BEETLES and DIPTEROUS LEAF MINERS. Do not apply within 10 days of harvest on Lettuce or Spinach; within 14 days on Beets; and within 10 days on Celery.

BROCCOLI, CABBAGE, CAULIFLOWER, COLLARDS, KALE, PARSLEY and TURNIP TOPS: Use 30 to 50 lbs. per acre to control APHIDS, IMPORTED CABBAGE WORMS, DIAMOND BACK MOTH, HARLEQUIN CABBAGE BUGS and CORN EARWORMS. Do not apply within 5 days of harvest on Broccoli or Cauliflower; within 7 days on Cabbage; within 10 days on Collards, Kale or Turnip tops; and within 12 days on Parsley.
