The labeling cited above and submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is accepted subject to the comments reflected on the enclosed sheet. A copy of your proposed labeling stamped "ACCEPTED WITH COMMENTS" is enclosed.

**WHAT THIS ACCEPTANCE MEANS:**

Based on your certification, the Agency has accepted the labeling changes that are necessary to comply with the Worker Protection Standard (WPS) labeling requirements of 40 CFR part 156, subpart K, described in PR Notices 93-7 and 93-11. Any other labeling changes submitted in connection with this amendment application but not directly related to compliance with the WPS have not been reviewed or accepted by the Agency. If you wish to make such changes, you must submit a separate amendment application proposing them. If your product is currently suspended, the acceptance of this labeling amendment does not affect the suspension in any way.

**WHAT YOU NEED TO DO NEXT:**

By the next label printing make all the specified changes to your labeling. Send to EPA one (1) copy of the final printed labeling:

- BEFORE selling or distributing any product bearing the final printed labeling



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**STORAGE AND DISPOSAL**

- 1. **Precautions** — Do not contaminate water, food or feed by storage or disposal.
- 2. **Pesticide Disposal** — Wastes resulting from the use of this product may be disposed of on site or at an approved waste disposal facility.
- 3. **Container Disposal** — Triple rinse (or equivalent). Then offer for recycling or reconditioning, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by other approved site and local procedures.
- 4. **Storage** — Store in original container only and keep sealed. Store in closed storage areas. Use caution when moving, opening, closing or pouring.

**DIRECTIONS FOR USE (cont.)**

Do not mix this material with other materials not compatible with it. Observe precautions when applying oil-based insecticides to crops during high temperatures since some crops are more than susceptible to injury. Do not apply within 14 days of culture or culture containing sprays. Consult your county agent for proper dosage when applying by aircraft.

Use a designated amount of product in the following gallons of water per acre unless otherwise noted: Ground Application — Field Crops — 20 to 250 gal. Air Application — Field Crops — 3 to 10 gal.

Do not apply this product through any type of irrigation system.

**FORAGE CROPS (Alfalfa, Grass and Soybeans):** Apply at the rate of 2-3 quarts (1 to 1 1/2 lbs. of active) per acre for the control of ALFALFA WEEVIL (LARVAE), ALFALFA WEEVIL, FALL ARMYWORM, PEA WEEVIL, SOYBEAN CATERPILLAR and VELVET BEAN CATERPILLAR. (May be used in conjunction with molasses for alfalfa weed control.)

Mix with water (both high and low volume spraying) to give correct coverage per acre. Start applications at first sign of infestation and repeat at 7-10 day intervals as needed for control. Do not apply later than 7 days before harvest or grazing.

**LIVESTOCK (Beef Cattle and Pigs):** For control of HORNFLIE, mix 1 quart in 12 1/2 gallons of water and apply two (2) quarts of spray to each mature animal. For control of LICE, apply as drenching spray. For control of HOE LICE, mix 1 quart in 12 1/2 gallons of water and apply as a drenching spray.

Do not use on dairy animals or in dairy barns. Do not use in dipping vats.

**PEAS:** For control of PEA WEEVIL and ARMYWORM, use 3-4 quarts (1 1/2 to 2 lbs. active) per acre. Do not apply within 7 days of harvest or grazing.

**SHADE TREES, ORNAMENTALS:** For control of JAPANESE BEETLE, LEAFHOPPER, TENT CATERPILLARS, CANKERWORMS and ROSE CHAPER, apply at the rate of 2-3 quarts (1-1 1/2 lbs. active) in 100 gallons of water (3-5 tablespoons in 1 gallon of water).

For ELM BARK BEETLE (control of DUTCH ELM DISEASE), apply at the rate of 4 gallons per 100 gallons of water. Spray trunk and limbs thoroughly. Repeat every 7-10 days through growing season.

**RESIDUAL SPRAY IN FLOUR MILLS, IN GRAM AND OTHER CEREAL STORAGE (Not For Use In Outdoors)**

- 1. Use 1 gallon per 10 gallons of water (2 quarts per 5 gallons), as a residual spray application to woodwork in empty bins and other grain storage which previously have been thoroughly cleaned.
- 2. Apply by means of a knapsack, garden or power sprayer at the rate of 2 gallons per 100 sq. ft. for control of the above insects which are exposed or become susceptible by emerging from burrows and cracks of the woodwork after cleaning empty bins.
