

ACCEPTED

CONVENTIONAL WASHER—1 cup Bleach to usual suds or first rinse (15 gal. load). Rinse well.

AUTOMATIC WASHER—1 cup Bleach diluted in 1 qt. water. Add to suds and start machine (15 gal. load).

PREFERRED METHOD—For white cotton, linen and nylon in first rinsing water add a half cup of Bleach for each five gallons of lukewarm water. Rinse thoroughly in clean water.

COLORED CLOTHES—Fast color cotton and linen may be soaked in the same solution but don't let stand more than five minutes.

SOAK IN WATER—Make suds in usual way then add a 1/2 cup of Bleach for each five gallons lukewarm water. Mix thoroughly, immerse clothes completely, and soak about fifteen minutes. Wash and rinse thoroughly.

CLOTHES YELLOWED—With age or especially grimy and dingy. Clothes should be allowed to stand overnight in a solution of half cup of Bleach to five gallons of water.

BABY CLOTHES—For the sanitary washing and refreshing of diapers, rubber goods, linen and cotton goods, use Bleach. After first flushing diapers, etc., soak from half to one hour in solution, three tablespoons to a gallon of lukewarm water. Rinse well in clean water. No boiling.

TO REMOVE MILDEW AND STAIN—Such as ink, grass, fruits, medicine, blood, tea, coffee, scorch, etc., from white linen and cotton, soak fifteen minutes in a solution of three tablespoons of Bleach in a quart of lukewarm water. If stain is obstinate, add three tablespoons of vinegar. Wash article thoroughly before placing in solution. Rinse it thoroughly. Hang mildewed article in sunlight.

FOR FARM AND DRINKS—To help keep down bacteria count and disinfect dairy utensils: milk bottles, milking machines, cream separator, pails, cans, strainer, rubber teat cups, ice cream freezers, etc. Wash thoroughly with hot water suds. Make a solution of one ounce of Bleach to each 2 gallons of water. Soak thoroughly about fifteen minutes just before using. When concentrations exceeding 200 ppm available chlorine are used, rinse thoroughly with a 100-200 ppm solution and drain dry before use.

CAUTION: Do not use on silks, wools, or acetate. Use only on white and fast colors. Do not spill Bleach directly on clothes.

CAUTION: KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN. HARMFUL IF SWALLOWED. SKIN AND EYE CONTACT MAY CAUSE SEVERE IRRITATION. AVOID CONTACT WITH SKIN AND EYES.

NOTE: Wash in Feed milk or cooked cereal followed by olive oil or cooking oil. Call a physician in event. Rinse immediately with cold water.

To whiten 100% nylon, yellow with age, use ¼ cup Bleach to a gallon of water. Soak 15 minutes. Rinse well. Repeat if necessary.

BATHROOM—To remove stains and kill odors from the toilet bowl pour one cup of Bleach into the bowl and allow to stand several hours or overnight. The dilution recommended for disinfecting must be based on the residual water in the bowl (96 ounces). Wash the bathtub and washbowl frequently with a solution of ½ cup of Bleach to a gallon of warm suds. If disinfection is desired rinse the cleaned fixtures thoroughly with a fresh solution of 2 ozs. Bleach in 1 gallon of water.

REFRIGERATOR—Add ½ cup of Bleach to a gallon of water for washing refrigerator. It will banish odors and keep the box sweet.

DRAINS—To keep drains clean and prevent unpleasant odors pour a quantity of warm water into the drain and then flush with a cup of Bleach.

GARBAGE CANS—Add 1 cup of Bleach to a gallon of warm suds and allow to stand 15 minutes. Scrub well, rinse. This will clean and deodorize.

SINK, DRAINBOARD, WINDOWS, WOODWORK, TILE, LINOLEUM, and ENAMELWARE—To remove discolorations, dirt and grease and keep them sparkling clean, add ½ cup Bleach to a gallon of scrubbing suds. For stubborn stains, saturate a damp cloth with Bleach and allow to stand on stained area for several hours.

SICK ROOM UTENSILS, toilet accessories, etc., should be washed in a solution of 1 cup of Bleach to a gallon of water. After cleaning immerse or rinse in a fresh solution of the same strength.

DIRECTIONS FOR SANITIZING EATING AND DRINKING UTENSILS

1. Scrape and prewash utensils and glasses whenever possible.
2. Wash with a good detergent or compatible cleaner.
3. Rinse with clean water.
4. Sanitize in solution of 1 oz. to 2 gallons of water (200 p.p.m.) immerse all utensils for at least two minutes or for contact time specified by governing sanitary code.
5. Place sanitized utensils on a rack or drainboard to air dry.
