The Agency is in receipt of your Application for Pesticide Notification under Pesticide Registration Notice (PRN) 98-10 for the above referenced product. The Antimicrobials Division (AD) has conducted a review of this request for its applicability under PRN 98-10 and finds that the action requested falls within the scope of PRN 98-10.

The primary brand name, **MPXP**, have been added to the product record.

The label submitted with the application has been stamped "Notification" and will be placed in our records.

Should you wish to add/retain a reference to the company's website on your label, then please be aware that the website becomes labeling under the Federal Insecticide Fungicide and Rodenticide Act and is subject to review by the Agency. If the website is false or misleading, the product would be misbranded and unlawful to sell or distribute under FIFRA section 12(a)(1)(E). 40 CFR 156.10(a)(5) lists examples of statements EPA may consider false or misleading. In addition, regardless of whether a website is referenced on your product's label, claims made on the website may not substantially differ from those claims approved through the registration process. **MPXP** will control all types of fungal decay of wood products - brown, white and soft rot. Apply this product by vacuum pressure or dip treatment to impregnate wood products that will be exposed to conditions favorable to rot or decay above ground, in ground, or in water.

Dilute **MPXP** with water to solutions having concentrations ranging from 0.05% to 3.13% total active ingredients by weight. To prepare a 1,000-gallon solution containing 0.8% total actives, combine 987.1 gallons of water and 12.9 gallons of **MPXP**. For other treating solution strength scenarios, adjust the **MPXP** concentration to meet the desired copper/azole/penflufen level. Water will make up the difference. The below table represents the uses/commodities, maximum application rates, minimum retention in pounds per cubic foot (pcf) of each active ingredient, and minimum total active retention for each use/commodity category.

**Drums:** Nonrefillable container. Do not reuse this container to hold materials other than pesticides or dilute pesticides (rinsate). After emptying and cleaning, it may be allowable to temporarily hold rinsate or other pesticide-related materials in the container. Contact your state regulatory agency to determine allowable practices in your state. Residue Removal: Triple rinse container (or equivalent) promptly after emptying. Triple rinse as follows: Empty the remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank. Fill the container ¼ full with water. Replace and tighten closures. Tip container on its side and roll it back and forth, ensuring at least one complete revolution, for 30 seconds. Stand the container on its end and tip it back and forth several times. Turn the container over onto its other end and tip it back and forth several times. Empty the rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Repeat the procedure two more times. Offer for reconditioning, if appropriate, or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by other procedures approved by state and local authorities.

**Totes:** Nonrefillable container. Do not reuse this container to hold materials other than pesticides or dilute pesticides (rinsate). After emptying and cleaning, it may be allowable to temporarily hold rinsate or other pesticide-related materials in the container. Contact your state regulatory agency to determine allowable practices in your state. Empty tote container must be returned to a tote collection agent. Residue Removal: Cleaning container before final disposal is the responsibility of the person disposing of the container. To clean container before final disposal, fill container about 10 percent full with water. Agitate container vigorously; discard rinsate according to pesticide disposal instructions. Repeat this rinsing procedure two more times. For additional container disposal information, contact product supplier.

**Containers 5 gallons or less:** Nonrefillable container. Do not reuse this container to hold materials other than pesticides or dilute pesticides (rinsate). After emptying and cleaning, it may be allowable to temporarily hold rinsate or other pesticide-related materials in the container. Contact your state regulatory agency to determine allowable practices in your state. Triple rinse container (or equivalent) promptly after emptying. Triple Rinse as follows: Empty remaining contents into application equipment or a mix tank and drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Fill the container ¼ full with water and recap. Shake for 10 seconds. Pour rinsate into application equipment or a mix tank or store rinsate for later use or disposal. Drain for 10 seconds after the flow begins to drip. Repeat this procedure two more times. Then offer for recycling if available or puncture and dispose of in a sanitary landfill, or by incineration.
