Dear Mr. Klein:

The following amendment, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is acceptable with the conditions listed below:

- Primary Brand Name Change
- Adding a dust mite claim
- Updating label per PR Notice 2001-1

Conditions

Revise the label as follows:

1. You must delete the claim, "Also eliminates house dust mites from treated materials." In order to add this claim to your label, you must provide information as to why live dust mites are a problem on textiles. You need to explain the potential damage the living mites can do to these textiles? We do not have data that demonstrates that house dust mites damage textiles. If the dust mite claim is to be used as lead for allergy relief claims, these are not unacceptable according to PR Notice 2000-1. You will also need to provide data showing this product is effective against house dust mites.
2. Under the "Precautionary Statements," you must revise the 6th sentence to include "protective clothing and rubber gloves," because this product is classified as Toxicity Category I for primary skin irritation. (You should refer to the Label Manual, Chapter 8 for guidance.)


General Comments

STATEMENT OF PRACTICAL TREATMENT - FIRST AID
