Amendment - Final Label Revisions Tempo Ready-to-Use Insecticide EPA Registration No. 3125-503

Your submissions dated June 1, 2000

Dear Ms. Spagnoli:

The labeling referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA), as amended, is acceptable, subject to the comments listed below. A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.

1. EPA has issued PR Notice 2000-3 revising first aid statements. The following are revised statements that will be required for products placed in toxicity category III and above. You may wish to incorporate these statements on your labeling at this time. These revisions must be made by October 1, 2001.

"IF SWALLOWED: Call a poison control center or doctor immediately for treatment advice. Have a person sip a glass of water if able to swallow. Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by a poison control center or a doctor. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

IF INHALED: Move person to fresh air. If person is not breathing, call 911 or an ambulance, then give artificial respiration, preferably mouth-to-mouth if possible. Call a poison control center or doctor for further treatment advice".

IF ON SKIN OR CLOTHING: Take off contaminated clothing. Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15-20 minutes. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

IF IN EYES: Hold eye open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15-20 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eyes. Call a poison control center for treatment advice.


