On the basis of information furnished by the registrant, the above named pesticide is hereby registered/reregistered under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act.

Registration is in no way to be construed as an endorsement or recommendation of this product by the Agency. In order to protect health and the environment, the Administrator, on his motion, may at any time suspend or cancel the registration of a pesticide in accordance with the Act The acceptance of any name in connection with the registration of a product under this Act is not to be construed as giving the registrant a right to exclusive use of the name or to its use if it has been covered by others.

This product is conditionally registered in accordance with FIFRA sec.3(c)(7)(C) since you agreed in your letter dated December 6, 2000 that:

- 1. You will submit by March 1, 2001 the protocol and locations for conduct of the 2001 market test for 2,000 human subjects.
- 2. You will submit by April 15, 2001 the final complete results of the 90-day rat subchronic oral study conducted in accordance with the 40 CFR Part 158 test quidelines.
- 3. You will submit/cite all data required for registration/reregistration of your product under FIFRA section 3 (c)(5) or 4(a) when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data.
- 4. You will submit production information (pounds or gallons produced) for this product for the fiscal year in which the use as a human skin applied insect repellent is conditionally registered, in accordance with FIFRA section 29. This fiscal year begins October 1, 2000 and ends September 30, 2001. The production information will be submitted to the Agency no later than November 15, 2001 following the end of the preceding fiscal year.

- 5. You will submit by December 1, 2001 to submit the results of the marketing test with up to 2,000 human subjects.
- 6. You will report adverse effects information resulting from use of any of the subject end-use products as required by Section 6(a)(2) of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA).
- 7. You will submit by December 1, 2001 all product performance data collected during the conduct of the 2001 market test.
- 8. You will submit within 7 days of receipt of this conditional registration a revised basic Confidential Statement of Formula (CSF) for the subject product. The nominal concentration of the picaridin technical source on the Confidential Statement of Formula (CSF) for the subject product must reflect the identical concentration of 96.8 percent as depicted on the picaridin technical label and CSF. Revise the respective Confidential Statement of Formula to reflect this change.

- 9. Make the following label changes before you release the product for shipment:
  - a. Revise the EPA Registration No. to read: "EPA Registration No. 3125-548"
- 10. Submit two (2) copies of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment.

You should note if you fail to satisfy any of the conditions imposed on this registration, e.g., you fail to submit the required data by the specified deadlines or the data submitted were not generated in accordance with applicable test guidelines, EPA may issue notice to cancel this use under FIFRA 6(e).

You should also note that, regardless of whether you satisfy all applicable conditions, this <u>conditional</u> registration will expire automatically on December 1, 2001. Sale and distribution of the subject product bearing labeling for use as a human skin applied insect repellent after December 1, 2001 will be illegal.

Finally, once the required data have been submitted and evaluated, EPA will entertain an application to amend the registration of the subject product to allow unconditional use as a human skin applied insect repellent without any special restrictions on the duration of registration.
