The amendment referred to above submitted in connection with registration under FIFRA sec. 3(c)(7)(A), is acceptable, provided that you:

1. Submit and/or cite all data required for registration/re-registration of your product under FIFRA sec. 3(c)(5) when the Agency requires all registrants of similar products to submit such data.

2. Make the labeling changes listed below before you release the product for shipment bearing the amended labeling:

A. Background:

1. Acute oral LD50, dermal LD50, primary dermal and eye irritation studies were conducted on this formulation at Hazleton-Raltech. The registrant was indicated in a cover letter dated September 7, 1932, concern with the results of the eye irritation study.

B. Comments and Recommendations

1. The acute oral LD50, dermal LD50, and primary dermal irritation studies received September 16, 1932, are acceptable.

2. The primary eye irritation study received September 16, 1932, is also acceptable. However, our interpretation of the results is that the product is in toxicity Category II (signal word WARNING) by the eye exposure route. This interpretation is based on the fact that one eye showed corneal opacity on day 21. The signal word "Warning" must appear on the label.

a. There should be a statement on the label something like: "Do not get in animal's eyes" rather than the present "Do not leave in eyes."

b. The statement "It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling" must appear at the heading of the Directions for Use. The disposal statement should read "Do not reuse empty container. Wrap container and put in trash collection."

Data submitted with the application have been assigned accession no. 246914.

3. Submit five (5) copies of your final printed labeling before you release the product for shipment.

If these conditions are not complied with, the registration will be subject to cancellation in accordance with FIFRA sec. 6(e). Your release for shipment of the product constitutes acceptance of these conditions.

A stamped copy of the label is enclosed for your records.
