Vertagreen Lindane 20% Concentrate

EPA Registration No. 3442-739

Your Application Dated January 13, 1986

The amendment referred to above, submitted in connection with registration under the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act, as amended, is acceptable provided that you make the labeling changes indicated below prior to release for shipment of product bearing the amended labeling.

- 1. Delete "xylene" from the ingredients statement, since it is not active in this formulation, and add its percentage to that of the inerts. Then add a footnote to the "Inert Ingredients" indicating "contains xylene".
- Revise the Environmental Hazards statement as follows:

This pesticide is toxic to fish, birds, and other wildlife. Do not apply directly to water, to areas where surface water is present or to intertidal waters below the mean high water mark. Drifts and runoff from treated areas may be hazardous to fish in neighboring areas. Do not contaminate when disposing of equipment washwaters.

- 3. The re-entry precautionary statements must be grouped together under the heading RE-ENTRY STATEMENT.
- Delete "For Structural Treatment". There are no structural pests listed on the label nor instructions for controlling structural pests. The paragraph beginning "Applicators working in enclosed areas... etc.", should appear beneath the "Premise Spray and Treatments" paragraph.

- 6. Add the following precaution under Direction for Use:
  - "Do not apply this product through any type of irrigation system. \*
- 7. The restricted use heading and paragraph must be on the top center of the front panel and preferably blocked.
- The livestock precautions under "Insect Control for Livestock" for both products Vertagreen Lindane 20 and 8. 12.5% should be consistent. We suggest you review the use limitation in the Lindane Reregistration Guidance Document for livestock use and revise your labels accordingly.

In reference to the product chemistry. on the data matrix please provide the pH at a specific water dilution.



## PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS

## HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

#### **WARNING**

## PROTECTIVE CLOTHING REQUIRED

Applicators must wear the following protective clothing during the application process: a light-weight, protective suit or coveralls, water-resistant hat, unlined, waterproof gloves, and unlined, light-weight boots. Mixers and loaders must also wear goggles or a face shield, waterproof gloves and a waterproof apron.

# INSECT CONTROL FOR ORNAMENTALS, FRUITS TREES, FLOWERS, BULBS AND VEGETABLES

Soil application: Do not make soil application to root crops, which might absorb a musty flavor. Do not apply in soil which will be planted to root crops (except potatoes) within 1 year. Do not use in soil which will be planted to potatoes within 2 years.

The following insect Control Chart gives the plants that may be attacked by the listed insects with a dilution rate and comments for proper application.

Do not plant any food or feed crop in rotation after a field treatment with lindane unless it is a registered use for lindane.

#### FOR STRUCTURAL TREATMENT

Applicators working in enclosed areas such as crawl spaces must wear a pesticide respirator jointly approved by MSHA (Mine Safety and Health Administration) and NIOSH (National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health) under the provisions of 30 CFR Part 11.

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Do not enter treated areas without protective clothing for 24 hours. Written or oral warnings must be given to workers who are expected to be in a treated area or in an area about to be treated with this product. (Indicate specific oral warnings which inform workers of areas or fields that may not be entered without specific protective clothing, period of time field must be vacated and appropriate actions to take in case of accidental exposure). When oral warnings are given, warnings shall be given in a language customarily understood by workers. Oral warnings must be given if there is reason to believe that written warnings cannot be understood by workers. Written warnings must include the following information.

WARNING - Area treated with Lindane 20% Concentrate on (date of application). Do not enter without appropriate protective clothing for 24 hours. In case of accidental exposure refer to the Statement of Practical Treatment on the pesticide label.

PECANS: For control of Phylloxera (Galls) and the Hickory Shoot Curculio-Mix 1 quart of this product in 100 gallons of water (2 teaspoonsfuls per gallon of water). Apply with a power sprayer in the spring as a "Bud Break" spray (early to mid April when bud break is no more than 2 inches long) making only one application by thoroughly wetting all portions of the tree and new bud growth. Plan on using approximately 10 to 15 gallons of diluted spray per bearing tree when planted on 60 foot centers (approx. 24 trees per acre). Do not exceed 450 gallons of dilute spray per acre. Do not graze treated area. NOTE: This control is not effective when typical gall symptons appear.

INSECT CONTOL FOR LIVESTOCK

Precautions-Do not apply to Dairy Cattle or Dairy Goats. Do not apply spray to Beef Cattle, Hogs, Sheep or Goats within 30 days of slaughter.

Do not apply to these animals within 30 days of giving birth to young nor for at least 3 weeks thereafter. Do not treat nursing animals. Do not apply to Pigs, Sheep and Goats less than 3 months old. Do not apply to calves less than 5 months old. Do not treat animals in cold, stormy weather. Do not treat overheated or sick animals.

Do not apply to feed of forage to be fed to or grazed by livestock or poultry. Do not contaminate feed or food crops. Do not use on poultry or in poultry houses. HORNFLIES on Beef Cattle - Mix 1 tbsp. per 2½ gallons water (8 ounces per 40 gallons water). Use a power sprayer to thoroughly treat animals. Treat when flies appear and repeat as needed for control. LICE & TICKS on Beef Cattle, Horses, Sheep & Goats. Mix 1 tbsp. per 2½ gallons water (8 ounces per 40 gallons water). Use a power sprayer to thoroughly wet animals hide. Repeat as needed for control.

SARCOPTIC MANGE MITE, LICE, TICKS on Hogs-Mix 2 tbsp. per 2½ gallons water (8 ounces in 20 gallons water). Use a power sprayer to thoroughly wet hide of animals. Do not apply to young animals. Repeat as needed.

SARCOPTIC MANGE on Beef Cattle and PSOROPTIC MANGE (Sheep Scabies) on Sheep and Goats-Mix 1 tbsp. per 2½ gallons water (8 ounces in 40 gallons water). Use a power sprayer to thoroughly wet animals. Use 2 or more treatments at 7 to 10 day intervals as needed for control. Observe good sanitation practices and spray pens and shelters to prevent reinfestation. Treat infested animals before adding to "herd."

PREMISE SPRAY AND TREATMENTS

Lindane must not be applied to currently occupied areas (ie. living or working areas).

Do not apply in Dairy Barns, Poultry Houses or Milk Rooms. For FLIES, ROACHES, SPIDERS, ANTS AND MOSQUITOES in Livestock Pens and building, spray with a .3% solution by mixing 4 tbsp. per 1 gallon of water (8 ounces per 4 gallons water). Do not use in the home. Apply 1 gallon of spray mixture to cover 500 sq. ft. of surface. Spray to point of run-off. For crawling insects treat thoroughly cracks, crevices, baseboards and other hiding places. Remove animals before spraying. Do not contaminate milk or milking equipment, feed or drinking water. Repeat as needed for control. To make a "PAINT" mix 8 ounces per 1 gallon of water. Apply with a brush as a spot treatment to cracks and crevices and other hiding places. Do not use on painted surfaces since it will blister the paint. Do not use in the home. Remove or do not treat or contaminate milk, milking equipment, feed or drinking water.

For TICKS and CHIGGERS on Lawns, Recreation areas, Camp Grounds, Golf Courses, and Play Grounds mix 40 ounces in 50 gallons water and apply at the rate of 50 gallons of the mixture per acre (equals \( \frac{1}{2} \) lb. actual Lindane per acre). For small areas apply 1 gallon of the spray mixture per 1,000 sc. ft. A small pressure sprayer or power sprayer should be used to insure thorough vegetation coverage.

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#### STORAGE AND DISPOSAL

(Note: Heading must be 12 Pt. minimum type size)

Do not contaminate water, food, or feed by storage or disposal.

Storage-Store in a cool, dry place.

Pesticide Disposal-Pesticide wastes are toxic. Improper disposal of excess pesticide, spray mixture, or rinsate is a violation of Federal Law. If these wastes cannot be disposed of by use according to label instructions, contact your State Pesticide or Environmental Control Agency, or the Hazardous Waste representative at the nearest EPA Regional Office for guidance.
