A copy of the labeling accepted for registration is returned herewith.

Claims or directions for use which differ in substance from the representations made in connection with the application or changes in the name or formula of the economic poison covered by this notice should not be made prior to their submission to the Pesticide Regulation Section, and receipt of notice that they have been accepted.

Registration of a product is in no way to be construed as an endorsement or approval by this Department of any claims made for it. The labeling must not bear any reference to registration under this Act. In order to protect the public, the Secretary, on his own motion, may at any time cancel the registration of an economic poison and, in lieu thereof, issue a registration under protest, in accordance with Section 4 (c) of the Act. *In no event shall registration of an article, whether or not protested, be construed as a defense for the commission of any offense prohibited under Section 3 of the Act.* The acceptance of any name in connection with the registration of a product under this Act is not to be construed as giving the registrant a right to exclusive use of the name or to its use if it has been covered by a trademark held by others.

A request for registration under a new formula or labeling may be submitted at any time.

Inert Ingredients:
Cereal Base.....99.975%

Directions

RATS: Suggested Use: This bait is ready to use. Put 1/3 cup or 2 oz. of bait in shallow containers placed in locations frequented by rats and mice and protect from children and pets by means of bait boxes or cages where necessary. Check containers daily and if entirely eaten increase the amount of feed, replacing any decomposed, mouldy, or sour baits. Where a continuous source of infestation prevails, permanent bait stations should be used and baits replenished as needed.

MICE: Follow the same general directions as for rats except bait placements may be smaller and more placements should be made. Complete control may take a longer period of baiting.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

BAITING SHOULD CONTINUE UNTIL COMPLETE LACK OF FEEDING IS NOTED.
THIS SHOULD BE FROM FIVE TO FOURTEEN DAYS.

CAUTION: This bait contains as its active ingredient an anticoagulant chemical which if taken accidentally by humans or animals may reduce the clotting ability of the blood and serious hemorrhage may result. In case baits are accidentally eaten by a human, give a tablespoon full of salt in a glass of warm water and repeat until vomit fluid is clear. Call a physician immediately.

ANTIDOTE: Use Vitamin K.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN: Treat patient as for an overdose of Dicumarol.
